#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 4311.04 of the Kevised Code be	4
amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4511.84. (A) No person shall operate a motor vehicle	6
while wearing earphones over, or earplugs in, both ears. As used	7
in this section, "earphones" means any headset, radio, tape	8
player, or other similar device that provides the listener with	9
radio programs, music, or other recorded information through a	10
device attached to the head and that covers all or a portion of	11
both ears. "Earphones" does not include speakers or other	12
listening devices that are built into protective headgear.	13
(B) This section does not apply to:	14
(1) Any person wearing a hearing aid;	15

(2) Law enforcement personnel while on duty;	16
(3) Fire department personnel and emergency medical	17

(4) Any person engaged in the operation of equipment for	19
use in the maintenance or repair of any highway;	20

collection equipment;	22
(6) Any person wearing earplugs for hearing protection	23
while operating a motorcycle.	24
(C) Except as otherwise provided in this division, whoever	25
violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If,	26
within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been	
convicted of or pleaded guilty to one predicate motor vehicle or	
traffic offense, whoever violates this section is guilty of a	29
misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If, within one year of the	30
offense, the offender previously has been convicted of two or	31
more predicate motor vehicle or traffic offenses, whoever	32
violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third	
degree.	34
