A BILL

To amend section 154.22 of the Revised Code and to 1
amend Sections 211.10 and 211.20 of Am. Sub. 2
H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly and 3
Sections 207.230, 207.440, 215.10, 223.10, 4
223.40, and 223.50 of H.B. 529 of the 132nd 5
General Assembly to allow equipment for the 6
protection and preservation of Lake Erie to be 7
purchased with proceeds from the Parks and 8
Recreation Improvement Fund and to appropriate 9
funds for projects enhancing water quality in 10
the Western Lake Erie Basin. 11

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 154.22 of the Revised Code be 12
amended to read as follows: 13

Sec. 154.22. (A) Subject to authorization by the general 14
assembly under section 154.02 of the Revised Code, the issuing 15
authority may authorize and issue obligations pursuant to this 16
chapter to pay costs of capital facilities for parks and 17
recreation. 18

(B) Any capital facilities for parks and recreation may be leased by the commission to the department of natural resources and other agreements may be made by the commission and such department with respect to the use or purchase of such capital facilities or, subject to the approval of the director of such department, the commission may lease such capital facilities to, and make other agreements with respect to their use or purchase with, any governmental agency having authority under law to operate such capital facilities, and the director of such department may sublease such capital facilities to, and make other agreements with respect to the use or purchase thereof with, any such governmental agency, or such director may sublease or contract for the operation of such capital facilities in accordance with the applicable provisions of sections 1501.09, 1501.091, and 1501.10 of the Revised Code, all upon such terms and conditions as the parties may agree upon and pursuant to this chapter, notwithstanding any other provisions of law affecting the leasing, acquisition, or disposition of capital facilities by such parties.

(C) For purposes of this section, "available receipts" means all receipts, including fees, charges, and rentals, derived or to be derived from state parks and public service facilities in any state park or parks, any other receipts of state agencies with respect to parks and recreational facilities, any revenues or receipts derived by the commission from the operation, leasing, or other disposition of capital facilities financed under this section, the proceeds of obligations issued under this section and sections 154.11 and 154.12 of the Revised Code, and also means any gifts, grants, donations, and pledges, and receipts thereon, available for the payment of bond service charges on obligations issued under this

section. The issuing authority may pledge all, or such portion 50
as it determines, of the available receipts to the payment of 51
bond service charges on obligations issued under this section 52
and sections 154.11 and 154.12 of the Revised Code and for the 53
establishment and maintenance of any reserves, as provided in 54
the bond proceedings, and make other provisions therein with 55
respect to such available receipts as authorized by this 56
chapter, which provisions shall be controlling notwithstanding 57
any other provision of law pertaining thereto. 58

(D) The issuing authority may covenant in the bond 59
proceeding that the state and state agencies shall, so long as 60
any obligations issued under this section are outstanding, cause 61
to be charged and collected fees, charges, and rentals for the 62
use of state parks and public service facilities and other fees 63
and charges with respect to parks and recreation sufficient in 64
amount to provide for the payment of bond service charges on 65
such obligations and for the establishment and maintenance of 66
any reserves as provided in the bond proceedings, and such 67
covenants shall be controlling notwithstanding any other 68
provision of law pertaining to such charges except any provision 69
of law prohibiting or limiting charges for the use of swimming 70
facilities of state parks and public service facilities by 71
persons under sixteen years of age. 72

(E) There is hereby created the parks and recreation bond 73
service trust fund, which shall be in the custody of the 74
treasurer of state but shall be separate and apart from and not 75
a part of the state treasury. All moneys received by or on 76
account of the commission or issuing authority or state agencies 77
and required by the applicable bond proceedings to be deposited, 78
transferred, or allocated to or received for the purposes of the 79
trust fund shall be deposited with the treasurer of state and 80

credited to such fund, subject to applicable provisions of the 81
bond proceedings but without necessity for any act of 82
appropriation. The trust fund is hereby pledged to the payment 83
of bond service charges on the obligations issued pursuant to 84
this section and sections 154.11 and 154.12 of the Revised Code 85
to the extent provided in the applicable bond proceedings, and 86
payment thereof from such fund shall be made or provided for by 87
the treasurer of state in accordance with such bond proceedings 88
without necessity for any act of appropriation. 89

(F) There is hereby created in the state treasury the 90
parks and recreation improvement fund. Subject to the bond 91
proceedings therefor, all of the proceeds of the sale of 92
obligations issued pursuant to this section shall be credited to 93
such fund, except that any accrued interest received shall be 94
credited to the parks and recreation bond service trust fund. 95
The parks and recreation improvement fund may also be comprised 96
of gifts, grants, appropriated moneys, and other sums and 97
securities received to the credit of ~~such the fund. Such The~~ 98
fund shall be applied ~~only to~~ for the purpose of paying costs of 99
capital facilities for parks and recreation under the 100
jurisdiction of the department of natural resources or for 101
participation in capital facilities for parks and recreation 102
with the federal government, municipal corporations, counties, 103
or other governmental agencies, or any one or more of them, 104
which participation may be by grants or contributions to them 105
for such capital facilities. The fund also may be used to 106
purchase equipment used for the protection or preservation of 107
Lake Erie and its tributaries. All investment earnings on the 108
cash balance in the fund shall be credited to the fund. 109

(G) All state parks shall be exclusively under the control 110
and administration of the division of parks and watercraft. The 111

director of natural resources may by order remove from the 112
classification as state parks any of the lands or interests 113
therein referred to in divisions (M) (2) and (3) of section 114
154.01 of the Revised Code, subject to the limitations, 115
provisions, and conditions in any order authorizing state park 116
revenue bonds, in any trust agreement securing such bonds, or in 117
bond proceedings with respect to obligations issued pursuant to 118
this section. Lands or interests therein so removed shall be 119
transferred to other divisions of the department for 120
administration or may be sold as provided by law. Proceeds of 121
any sale shall be used or transferred as provided in the order 122
authorizing state park revenue bonds or in such trust agreement, 123
or in bond proceedings with respect to obligations issued 124
pursuant to this section, and if no such provision is made shall 125
be transferred to the state park fund created by section 1546.21 126
of the Revised Code. 127

(H) This section shall be applied with other applicable 128
provisions of this chapter. 129

(I) Any instrument by which real property is acquired 130
pursuant to this section shall identify the agency of the state 131
that has the use and benefit of the real property as specified 132
in section 5301.012 of the Revised Code. 133

Section 2. That existing section 154.22 of the Revised 134
Code is hereby repealed. 135

Section 3. That Sections 211.10 and 211.20 of Am. Sub. 136
H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly be amended to read as 137
follows: 138

Of the foregoing appropriation item 700509, Soil and Water					251
District Support, \$350,000 in each fiscal year shall be used by					252
the Department of Agriculture for a program to support soil and					253

water conservation districts in the Western Lake Erie Basin in 254
complying with provisions of Sub. S.B. 1 of the 131st General 255
Assembly. The Department shall approve a soil and water 256
district's application for funding under the program if the 257
application demonstrates that funding will be used for, but not 258
limited to, providing technical assistance, developing 259
applicable nutrient or manure management plans, hiring and 260
training of soil and water conservation district staff on best 261
conservation practices, or other activities the Director 262
determines appropriate to assist farmers in the Western Lake 263
Erie Basin in complying with the provisions of Sub. S.B. 1 of 264

Of the foregoing appropriation item 700509, Soil and Water 266
District Support, \$3,500,000 in FY 2019 shall be used to support 267

nutrient management plan development, including manure 270
transformation and manure conversion technologies, enhanced 271
filter strips, water management, and other conservation support. 272

SOIL AND WATER DISTRICTS 273

In addition to state payments to soil and water 274
conservation districts authorized by section 940.08 of the 275
Revised Code, the Department of Agriculture may use 276
appropriation item 700661, Soil and Water Districts, to pay any 277
soil and water conservation district an annual amount not to 278
exceed \$40,000 upon receipt of a request and justification from 279
the district and approval by the Ohio Soil and Water 280
Conservation Commission. The county auditor shall credit the 281
payments to the special fund established under section 940.08 of 282
the Revised Code for use by the local soil and water 283

conservation district. The amounts received by each district	284
shall be expended for the purposes of the district.	285

 the General Assembly. These authorized obligations shall be 359
 issued, subject to applicable constitutional and statutory 360
 limitations, as needed to provide sufficient moneys to the 361
