BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5101.89 of the Revised Code be	4
enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 5101.89. (A) As used in this section:	6
(1) "Public assistance" means any of the following:	7
(a) Medicaid;	8
(b) Publicly funded child care provided under Chapter	9
5104. of the Revised Code;	10
(c) The Ohio works first program established under Chapter	11
5107. of the Revised Code;	12
(d) The supplemental nutrition assistance program provided	13
for by the "Food and Nutrition Act of 2008," 7 U.S.C. 2011 et	14
seq., as amended;	15

(e) The special supplemental nutrition program for women,	16	
infants, and children established under the "Child Nutrition Act	17	
of 1966," 80 Stat. 885, 42 U.S.C. 1786, as amended, administered	18	
by the department of health under section 3701.132 of the		
Revised Code.		
(2) "Public employer" has the same meaning as in section	21	
4167.01 of the Revised Code.	22	
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(3) "Private employer receiving state funds" means any	23	
individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability	24	
company, corporation, or any other entity that is doing business	25	
in this state and that received either of the following in the	26	
year immediately preceding the date on which the report	27	
described in division (B) of this section is due:	28

(a) Economic development assistance as defined in section	29

(b) A tax incentive as defined in section 122.942 of the	31

(B) Not later than one year after the effective date of	33	
this section, and every year thereafter, the director of job and	34	
family services, in consultation with the medicaid director, the	35	
director of administrative services, and the director of budget	36	
and management, shall complete a report that specifies all of	37	
the following:	38	
(1) The name of each of the twenty-five public employers	39	
and twenty-five private employers receiving state funds that	40	
employed the most employees who were either of the following		
while employed by the employer in this state during the previous		
year:	42

(a) Recipients of public assistance;	44	

(b) Employees whose incomes were counted in determining	45
eligibility for public assistance.	46
(2) The number of individuals described in divisions (B)	47
(1) (a) and (b) of this section who were employed in the previous	48
year by each employer specified in the report;	49
(3) The total cost to the state for the previous year of	50
providing public assistance to employees of each of the	51
employers specified in the report, specified separately for each	52
employer.	
(C) The report required under division (B) of this section	54
is a public record under section 149.43 of the Revised Code. The	55
report shall not include any identifying information about any	56
employee described in divisions (B) (1) (a) and (b) of this	57
section.	
(D) The director of job and family services shall provide	59
a copy of the report to all of the following:	60
(1) The general assembly in accordance with section 101.68	61
of the Revised Code;	62
(2) The director of development services;	63
(3) The director of budget and management;	64
(4) Each member of the tax credit authority;	65
(5) The nonprofit corporation formed under section 187.01	66
of the Revised Code;	67
(6) Each of the employers that are the subject of the	68
