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**A BILL**

To enact section 5101.89 of the Revised Code to 1  
require an annual report about certain employers 2  
of public assistance recipients. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 5101.89 of the Revised Code be 4  
enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 5101.89.** (A) As used in this section: 6

(1) "Public assistance" means any of the following: 7

(a) Medicaid; 8

(b) Publicly funded child care provided under Chapter 9  
5104. of the Revised Code; 10

(c) The Ohio works first program established under Chapter 11  
5107. of the Revised Code; 12

(d) The supplemental nutrition assistance program provided 13  
for by the "Food and Nutrition Act of 2008," 7 U.S.C. 2011 et 14  
seq., as amended; 15

(e) The special supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and children established under the "Child Nutrition Act of 1966," 80 Stat. 885, 42 U.S.C. 1786, as amended, administered by the department of health under section 3701.132 of the Revised Code. 16  
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(2) "Public employer" has the same meaning as in section 4167.01 of the Revised Code. 21  
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(3) "Private employer receiving state funds" means any individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, or any other entity that is doing business in this state and that received either of the following in the year immediately preceding the date on which the report described in division (B) of this section is due: 23  
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(a) Economic development assistance as defined in section 9.66 of the Revised Code; 29  
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(b) A tax incentive as defined in section 122.942 of the Revised Code. 31  
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(B) Not later than one year after the effective date of this section, and every year thereafter, the director of job and family services, in consultation with the medicaid director, the director of administrative services, and the director of budget and management, shall complete a report that specifies all of the following: 33  
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(1) The name of each of the twenty-five public employers and twenty-five private employers receiving state funds that employed the most employees who were either of the following while employed by the employer in this state during the previous year: 39  
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(a) Recipients of public assistance; 44

<u>(b) Employees whose incomes were counted in determining</u>	45
<u>eligibility for public assistance.</u>	46
<u>(2) The number of individuals described in divisions (B)</u>	47
<u>(1) (a) and (b) of this section who were employed in the previous</u>	48
<u>year by each employer specified in the report;</u>	49
<u>(3) The total cost to the state for the previous year of</u>	50
<u>providing public assistance to employees of each of the</u>	51
<u>employers specified in the report, specified separately for each</u>	52
<u>employer.</u>	53
<u>(C) The report required under division (B) of this section</u>	54
<u>is a public record under section 149.43 of the Revised Code. The</u>	55
<u>report shall not include any identifying information about any</u>	56
<u>employee described in divisions (B) (1) (a) and (b) of this</u>	57
<u>section.</u>	58
<u>(D) The director of job and family services shall provide</u>	59
<u>a copy of the report to all of the following:</u>	60
<u>(1) The general assembly in accordance with section 101.68</u>	61
<u>of the Revised Code;</u>	62
<u>(2) The director of development services;</u>	63
<u>(3) The director of budget and management;</u>	64
<u>(4) Each member of the tax credit authority;</u>	65
<u>(5) The nonprofit corporation formed under section 187.01</u>	66
<u>of the Revised Code;</u>	67
<u>(6) Each of the employers that are the subject of the</u>	68
<u>report.</u>	69
<u>(E) The director of job and family services shall make the</u>	70
<u>report available on a searchable internet web site.</u>	71
