## A BILL

To amend sections 4501.81 and 5502.11 of the	1
Revised Code to require an accident report to	2
indicate whether any person involved in the	3
accident wishes to be contacted for commercial	4
solicitation purposes, to prohibit any person	5
from using the information contained in an	6
accident report for those purposes with regard	7
to a person who did not agree to be contacted,	8
and to allow a person to submit emergency	9
contact information upon vehicle registration	10
for inclusion in the next of kin database.	11

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.81 and 5502.11 of the	12
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	13
Sec. 4501.81. (A) The bureau of motor vehicles shall	14
establish a database of the next of kin of persons who are	15
issued driver's licenses, commercial driver's licenses,	16
temporary instruction permits, motorcycle operator's licenses	17
and endorsements, and identification cards and to whom vehicle	<u>es</u> 18
are registered. Information in the database shall be accessib	le 19

only to employees of the bureau and to criminal justice agencies and is not a public record for purposes of section 149.43 of the Revised Code.

(B) When an individual submits an application to the 23 registrar of motor vehicles or a deputy registrar for a driver's 24 license, commercial driver's license, temporary instruction 25 permit, motorcycle operator's license or endorsement, or 26 identification card, or a renewal of any of them, or a vehicle 27 registration, the individual shall be furnished with a next of 28 kin information form-on which. On the form, the individual may 29 list the name, address, telephone number, and relationship to 30 the individual of at least one contact person whom the 31 individual wishes to be contacted if the individual is involved 32 in a motor vehicle accident or emergency situation and the 33 individual dies or is seriously injured or rendered unconscious 34 and is unable to communicate with the contact person. The 35 contact person may or may not be the next of kin of the 36 applicant, except that if the applicant is under eighteen years 37 of age and is not emancipated, the contact person shall include 38 the parent, guardian, or custodian of the applicant. 39

The form described in this division shall inform the 40 individual that, after completing the form, the individual may 41 return the form to the registrar or any deputy registrar, each 42 of whom shall accept the form from the individual without 43 payment of any fee. The form also shall contain the mailing 44 address of the bureau, to which the individual may mail the 45 completed form, and also instructions whereby the individual may 46 furnish the information described in this division to the 47 registrar through use of the internet. 48

(C) The bureau, in accordance with Chapter 119. of the

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Revised Code, shall adopt rules to implement this section. The 50 rules shall address all of the following: 51 (1) The methods whereby a person who has submitted the 52 name of a contact person for inclusion in the database may make 53 changes to that entry; 54 (2) The contents of the next of kin information form; 55 (3) Any other aspect of the database or its operation that 56 the registrar determines is necessary in order to implement this 57 section. 58 (D) In the event of a motor vehicle accident or emergency 59 situation in which a person dies or is seriously injured or 60 rendered unconscious and is unable to communicate with the 61 contact person specified in the database, an employee of a 62 criminal justice agency shall make a good faith effort to notify 63 the contact person of the situation, but neither the bureau nor 64 the employee nor the criminal justice agency that employs that 65 employee incurs any liability if the employee is not able to 66 make contact with the contact person. 67 Sec. 5502.11. Every law enforcement agency representing a 68 township, county, municipal corporation, or other political 69 subdivision investigating a motor vehicle accident involving a 70 fatality, personal injury, or property damage in an amount 71 greater than one thousand dollars, within five days, shall 72 forward a written report of such accident to the director of 73 public safety on a form, which the director shall adopt subject 74 to sections 119.01 to 119.13 of the Revised Code. The form shall 75 include a statement as to whether any person involved in the 76

accident wishes to be contacted for commercial solicitation 77 purposes. No person shall use the information contained in an 78

accident report to contact any other person for commercial	79
solicitation purposes unless that other person specified in the	80
accident report that the person wishes to be contacted.	81
Section 2. That existing sections 4501.81 and 5502.11 of	82
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	83
