BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) The Director of Public Safety shall submit	8
a proposal to the United States Federal Motor Carrier Safety	9
Administration requesting permission to do both of the	
following:	
(1) Temporarily suspend the requirement for the waiver of	12
the skills test for an applicant for a commercial driver's	13
license that is specified in division (D)(1)(c)(iii) of section	
4506.09 of the Revised Code;	15

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(2) Temporarily replace the requirement of division (D) (1)
(c) (iii) of section 4506.09 of the Revised Code with a
requirement that allows the applicant to certify and provide
evidence that for at least two years during the applicant's
military service or employment, the applicant operated a vehicle
representative of the commercial motor vehicle type that the
applicant operates or expects to operate.

(B) (1) If the United States Federal Motor Carrier Safety 23 Administration approves the proposal submitted under division 24 (A) of this section, the Director shall implement the waiver of 25 26 the skills test in a manner that incorporates the requirement specified in division (A)(2) of this section as a temporary 27 pilot program. The duration of the pilot program is four years 28 beginning not later than thirty days after the Director receives 29 approval from the United States Federal Motor Carrier Safety 30 Administration. 31

(2) During the four-year term of the pilot program, the
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operation of division (D)(1)(c)(iii) of section 4506.09 of the
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Revised Code is suspended. Upon termination of the pilot
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program, the operation of division (D)(1)(c)(iii) of that
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section is reinstated.

(C) Throughout the duration of the temporary pilot program
established under division (B) of this section, the Director
shall collect data regarding its implementation. Not later than
thirty days after the program ends, the Director shall submit a
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report summarizing that data to the Speaker of the House of
Representatives and the President of the Senate.

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
