BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 101.27, 141.01, 141.011, 141.04,21325.03, 325.04, 325.06, 325.08, 325.09, 325.10, 325.11, 325.14,22325.15, 325.18, 505.24, 507.09, 742.63, and 3501.12 be amended23and sections 101.61, 107.71, and 124.824 of the Revised Code be24enacted to read as follows:25

Sec. 101.27. (A) (1) Every member of the senate, except the 26 members elected president, president pro tempore, assistant 27 president pro tempore, majority whip, minority leader, assistant 28 minority leader, minority whip, and assistant minority whip, 29 shall receive as compensation a salary of fifty-one-sixty-three 30 thousand six hundred seventy-four seven dollars a year during 31 the senator's term of office. Every member of the house of 32 representatives, except the members elected speaker, speaker pro 33 tempore, majority floor leader, assistant majority floor leader, 34 majority whip, assistant majority whip, minority leader, 35 assistant minority leader, minority whip, and assistant minority 36 whip, shall receive as compensation a salary of fifty-one sixty-37 three thousand six hundred seventy-four seven dollars a year 38 during the representative's term of office. Such salaries shall 39 be paid in equal monthly installments during such term. All 40 monthly payments shall be made on or before the fifth day of 41 each month. Upon the death of any member of the general assembly 42 during the member's term of office, any unpaid salary due such 43 member for the remainder of the member's term shall be paid to 44 the member's surviving spouse, children, mother, or father, in 45 the order in which the relationship is set forth in this section 46 in monthly installments. 47

(2) Each member shall receive a travel reimbursement per

mile each way, at the same mileage rate allowed for the 49 reimbursement of travel expenses of state agents as provided by 50 rule of the director of budget and management pursuant to 51 division (B) of section 126.31 of the Revised Code, for mileage 52 not more than once a week during the session for travel incurred 53 by a member from and to the member's place of residence, by the 54 most direct highway route of public travel to and from the seat 55 of government, to be paid quarterly on the last day of March, 56 June, September, and December of each year. 57

each receive as compensation a salary of eighty ninety-eight

The vice-120 chairperson and ranking minority member of each standing 121 committee of each house other than the finance committee shall 122 each receive an additional sum of five six thousand seven 123 hundred fifty dollars annually. Except for the ranking minority 124 member of each standing subcommittee of a finance committee, the 125 ranking minority member of each standing subcommittee of each 126 house shall receive an additional sum of two-three thousand five-127 two hundred fifty dollars annually. 128

No member may receive more than one additional sum for129serving as chairperson, vice-chairperson, or ranking minority130member of a standing committee or standing subcommittee,131regardless of the number of standing committees or standing132subcommittees on which the member serves as chairperson, vice-133chairperson, or ranking minority member.134

A prosecuting attorney who elects not to engage 1127 in the private practice of law may, for a period of six months 1128 after taking office, engage in the private practice of law for 1129 the purpose of concluding the affairs of private practice of law 1130 without any diminution of salary as provided for in division (A) 1131 of this section and in section 325.18 of the Revised Code. 1132

(D) (C) As used in this section, "salary" does not include 1133 any portion of the cost, premium, or charge for health, medical, 1134 hospital, dental, or surgical benefits, or any combination of 1135 those benefits, covering the prosecuting attorney and paid on 1136 that person's behalf by a governmental entity. 1137

Such salary may be paid monthly out of the general county 1251 1252 fund or out of the county's share of the fund derived from the receipts from motor vehicle licenses, as distributed by section 1253 4501.04 of the Revised Code, and the county's share of the fund 1254 derived from the motor vehicle fuel tax, as distributed by 1255 section 5735.27 of the Revised Code, as the board of county 1256 commissioners directs, upon the warrant of the county auditor 1257 and shall be in lieu of all fees, costs, per diem or other 1258 allowances, and other perquisites, of whatever kind, which any 1259 engineer collects and receives. The engineer shall be the county 1260 tax map draftperson, but shall receive no additional 1261 compensation for performing the duties of that position. When 1262 the engineer performs service in connection with ditches or 1263 drainage works, the engineer shall charge and collect the per 1264 diem allowances or other fees provided by law and shall pay all 1265 of those allowances and fees, monthly, into the county treasury 1266 to the credit of the general county fund. The engineer shall pay 1267 into the county treasury all allowances and fees collected when 1268 the engineer performs services under sections 315.28 to 315.34 1269 of the Revised Code. 1270

(B) A county engineer may elect to engage or not to engage 1271 in the private practice of engineering or surveying before the 1272 commencement of each new term of office, and a county engineer 1273 who elects not to engage in the private practice of engineering 1274 or surveying may, for a period of six months after taking 1275 office, engage in the private practice of engineering or 1276 surveying for the purpose of concluding the affairs of private 1277 practice without any diminution of salary as provided in 1278 division (A) of this section and in section 325.18 of the 1279 Revised Code. 1280

(3) A benefit granted to a surviving spouse under division
(F) (1) (b) of this section shall commence on the first day of the
month immediately following receipt by the board of a completed
application on a form provided by the board and any evidence the
board may require to establish that the deceased spouse was
killed in the line of duty.

(G) (1) If there is not a surviving spouse eligible to
receive a death benefit under division (F) of this section or
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the surviving spouse receiving a death benefit under that

division dies, a surviving child or children whose benefits

under division (C) or (D) of this section are or have been 1891 terminated pursuant to division (C)(3) or (D)(3) of this section 1892 or who would qualify for a benefit under division (C) or (D) of 1893 this section except that the deceased member reached the 1894 member's retirement maximum pension eligibility date prior to 1895 the member's death shall receive a monthly death benefit under 1896 1897 this division. If there is more than one remaining 1912 eligible child, the benefit shall be divided equally among the 1913 eligible children. 1914

(3) A death benefit, or portion of a death benefit,1915payable to a surviving child under this division shall be1916reduced by an amount equal to any allowance or benefit payable1917to that child under section 742.3714 of the Revised Code, but1918the reduction in that child's benefit shall not affect the1919amount payable to any other surviving child entitled to a1920portion of the death benefit.1921
