**S. B. No. 43 – Senator Bacon**

To amend sections 504.04 and 504.13 of the Revised Code to enable limited home rule townships to adopt building codes regardless of any similar codes adopted by the county in which the township resides.

(Committee on Local Government, Public Safety and Veterans Affairs recommends passage June 27, 2017)

To amend section 1345.99 and to enact section 1345.022 of the Revised Code to prohibit the installation of unsafe used tires on certain motor vehicles.

To amend sections 3313.205, 3314.03, and 3326.11 and to enact sections 3314.13, 3321.141, and 3326.90 of the Revised Code to require a public school, within one hundred twenty minutes of the start of a school day, to notify the parent of a student who fails to arrive at school and is not excused from attendance.

(Committee on Education recommends passage of substitute bill March 1, 2018)

To amend section 149.43 and to enact section 149.436 of the Revised Code to exempt from the Public Records Law certain information concerning a minor that is included in a record related to a traffic accident involving a school vehicle in which the minor was an occupant at the time of the accident, to allow the parent or guardian of the minor to request a record of the accident containing the exempted information, and to exempt certain protected health information from the Public Records Law.
