The House met pursuant to adjournment.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 71 - Representative DeVitis.

Cosponsors: Representatives Arndt, Becker, Blessing, Brenner, Dever, Goodman, Hood, Merrin, Johnson, T., Roegner, Romanchuk, Seitz, Stein, Perales, Patmon.

To amend sections 4503.21 and 4511.043 of the Revised Code to specify that failure to display a license plate on the front of a motor vehicle that is required to display a front license plate is a secondary traffic offense and to establish a maximum fine of \$100 for such an offense.

H. B. No. 72 - Representatives Johnson, T., Antonio. Cosponsors: Representatives Blessing, Boccieri, Brenner, Fedor, Ginter, Hill, LaTourette, Sheehy.

To amend section 5167.12 and to enact sections 3901.82, 3901.821, 3901.822, 3901.823, 5164.7512, 5164.7513, and 5164.7514 of the Revised Code to adopt requirements related to step therapy protocols implemented by health plan issuers and the Department of Medicaid.

H. B. No. 73 - Representatives Rezabek, Koehler.

To enact section 2925.62 of the Revised Code to prohibit sales of dextromethorphan without a prescription to persons under age 18.

who is on active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States, or is the spouse of such an individual, and holds a valid license in another state.
