## THIRTY-FOURTH DAY

The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Ryan was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

**INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bills were introduced:

**H. B. No. 178** - Representative DeVitis.

To amend section 4928.02 and to enact sections 4928.75, 4928.751, 4928.752, 4928.753, 4928.754, 4928.755, 4928.756, 4928.757, 4928.7511, 4928.7513, 4928.7514, 4928.7515, 4928.7520, 4928.7521, 4928.7522, 4928.7523, 4928.7524, 4928.7525, 4928.7526, 4928.7527, 4928.7530, 4928.7532, 4928.7533, 4928.7534, and 4928.7540 of the Revised Code regarding the zero-emissions nuclear resource program.

**H. B. No. 179** - Representative Keller.

To amend sections 9.63 and 5747.502 and to enact sections 9.631, 9.632, and 9.633 of the Revised Code to require state and local authorities to cooperate with the federal government in the enforcement of immigration laws, to prohibit a local government that fails to do so from receiving certain state funds, to provide for the removal of officers of a local government that fails to do so, and to declare an emergency.

**H. B. No. 180** - Representatives Clyde, Howse.

To amend section 4117.08 and to enact sections 9.78, 9.781, 9.782, 9.783, 9.784, 9.785, 9.786, 9.787, 9.788, 142.01, 142.02, 142.03, 142.04, 142.05, 142.06, 142.07, 142.08, 142.09, 142.10, 4113.42, and 4117.141 of the Revised Code to require a contractor or person submitting a bid or other proposal for a state contract or a business entity applying for a grant or other economic incentive from a state agency to obtain an equal pay certificate, to require state agencies and political subdivisions to establish a job evaluation system to identify and eliminate sex-based wage disparities among classes of

employees, and to prohibit an employer from retaliating against an employee who discusses the employee's salary or wage rate with another employee.

To amend sections 3301.078, 3301.079, 3301.0710, 3301.0711, 3301.0712, 3301.0714, 3301.0718, 3301.0722, 3301.0728, 3302.01, 3302.02, 3302.03, 3302.036, 3302.05, 3310.03, 3310.14, 3310.522, 3311.80, 3311.84, 3313.60, 3313.603, 3313.608, 3313.6017, 3313.6020, 3313.61, 3313.612, 3313.618, 3314.016, 3314.02, 3314.05, 3314.08, 3314.26, 3317.03, 3319.02, 3319.111, 3319.23, 3326.37, 3328.01, 3333.0411, and 3365.05; to enact sections 3301.65 and 3319.324; and to repeal sections 3301.0721, 3319.112, and 3319.114 of the Revised Code with regard to the state academic content standards and primary and secondary education assessments.

I am directed to inform the House of Representatives that the Senate has passed the following bills in which the concurrence of the House is requested:

To amend sections 2903.11, 2919.22, 2929.01, 2929.13, and 2929.14 and to enact section 2941.1425 of the Revised Code to require an additional prison term of 3 to 8 years for an offender who is convicted in specified circumstances of a felony offense of endangering children or felonious assault of a child if the offender also is convicted of a specification that the victim suffered permanent disabling harm and to name the act "Destiny's Law."

To amend sections 118.05, 118.06, 118.11, 118.12, 118.13, and 118.99 and to repeal the version of section 118.023 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect September 29, 2017, to modify the composition and powers of the financial planning and supervision commission of a political subdivision that is in a state of fiscal emergency and to clarify the duties of that political subdivision.
