INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 346 - Representative West.

To enact section 5534.96 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 172 in Stark County as the "Football Heritage Corridor."

To enact section 5534.492 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of I-71 in Hamilton County as the "Sonny L. Kim Memorial Highway."

H. B. No. 348 - Representative Ginter.

To amend sections 1547.11, 2925.01, 2925.03, 2925.05, 2925.11, 2925.22, 2929.01, and 4511.19 of the Revised Code to provide that the penalty for trafficking in, possession of, or funding of trafficking in fentanyl or carfentanil is the same as the penalty for those crimes involving heroin, to increase to a third degree felony the trafficking in or possession of at least one gram but less than five grams of any of those drugs, to provide that deception to obtain a dangerous drug involving fentanyl or carfentanil is a third degree felony, and to provide a per se prohibited concentration of fentanyl and carfentanil regarding operating a vessel or motor vehicle that is the same as the per se prohibited concentration for heroin.

H. B. No. 349 - Representative LaTourette.

To amend sections 2921.321 and 2929.18 of the Revised Code to increase the penalty for assaulting a police dog or horse and to include search and rescue dogs and horses in the prohibition against assaulting or harassing a police animal.

Said bills were considered the first time.
