INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 390 - Representative Merrin.

To amend sections 1923.04 and 1923.14 of the Revised Code to clarify how

to calculate certain timelines under which a forcible entry and detainer action must occur.

H. B. No. 391 - Representative Merrin.

To amend section 2929.01 of the Revised Code to include the cost of accounting done to determine the extent of economic loss as a type of economic loss for which restitution may be granted.

H. B. No. 392 - Representative Stein.

Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Hambley, Henne, Hill, Kick, Koehler, Retherford, Riedel, Roegner, Thompson, West.

To enact section 909.19 of the Revised Code to grant specified apiary owners immunity in personal injury or property damage cases.

Said bills were considered the first time.

REPORTS OF STANDING AND SELECT COMMITTEES AND BILLS FOR SECOND CONSIDERATION

Representative Boggs submitted the following report:

The standing committee on Civil Justice to which was referred **H. B. No. 174**-Representatives Hughes, Lanese, et. al., having had the same under consideration, reports it back with the following amendment and recommends its passage when so amended.

RE: ADD JUDGES TO FRANKLIN COUNTY DOMESTIC
RELATIONS DIVISION

Representative Butler moved to amend the title as follows:

Add the names: "Boggs, Brown, Galonski."

Representative Rezabek moved to amend as follows:

In line 4 of the title, after "Pleas" insert ", one"; after "2018" insert "and one to be elected in 2020, and to declare an emergency"

In line 225, delete "and two" and insert "one"; delete "terms" and insert "term"

In line 226, delete the first ","" and insert ",""; delete "January 10, 2019, respectively" and insert "one to be elected in 2020, term to begin January 2, 2021"

In line 321, delete "10, 2019" and insert "2, 2021"

In line 1736, delete "Section 2301.03 of the Revised Code is"

Delete lines 1737 through 1744 and insert "This act is hereby declared

to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is to allow judicial candidates to meet the filing deadlines to appear on the ballot in 2018. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect.

Section 4. Section 2301.03 of the Revised Code is presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended by both Am. H.B. 11 and Am. Sub. H.B. 64 of the 131st General Assembly. The General Assembly, applying the principle stated in division (B) of section 1.52 of the Revised Code that amendments are to be harmonized if reasonably capable of simultaneous operation, finds that the composite is the resulting version of the section in effect prior to the effective date of the section as presented in this act."
