(B) If an individual is eligible for medicaid under this section even though the individual does not meet all of the applicable eligibility requirements for medicaid, only state funds shall be used for the medicaid payments made for the medicaid services provided to the individual.

(C) Section 5162.06 of the Revised Code does not apply to this section."

(3) Another identification document acceptable to the supplier.

(B) Nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting a supplier or a person acting on the supplier's behalf from completing a purchase for which the consumer is using another person's credit card, debit card, gift card, electronic benefit transfer card, or similar electronic device if the other person gave the consumer permission to use the device."
