The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Merrin was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 404 - Representative Patton.

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 4503.879 of the Revised Code to create the "West Technical High School Alumni" license plate.

H. B. No. 405 - Representative Perales.

Cosponsors: Representatives Butler, Boccieri, Dever, Fedor, Miller, Schaffer, Sheehy, Slaby, Smith, K., Sweeney, Vitale.

To amend section 2923.31 and to enact section 2913.30 of the Revised Code to create the offense of counterfeiting and to include counterfeiting within the definition of "corrupt activity" under the Corrupt Activities Law.

H. B. No. 406 - Representative Lanese.

Cosponsors: Representatives Hughes, Riedel, Goodman, Kent, Ginter, Young.

To amend sections 149.43 and 149.45 of the Revised Code to include forensic evaluation examiners and mental health evaluation providers as individuals whose residential and familial information is exempt from disclosure under the Public Records Law, and whose addresses public offices, upon request, must redact from records available to the general public on the internet.

H. B. No. 407 - Representatives Dever, Seitz.

To amend sections 2103.02, 2103.09, and 2106.24 of the Revised Code to abolish the estate by dower.

H. B. No. 408 - Representatives West, Boggs.

Cosponsors: Representatives Strahorn, Celebrezze, Antonio, Sykes, Boccieri, Ramos, Lepore-Hagan, Kent, Smith, K., Holmes, Galonski, Ashford.

To enact section 5.22108 of the Revised Code to create the Health Insurance Participation Week.

H. B. No. 409 - Representatives Butler, Perales.

Cosponsors: Representatives Retherford, Boccieri, Brenner, Goodman, Hambley, Henne, Johnson, Kent, Lanese, O'Brien, Rezabek, Riedel, Scherer, Seitz, Sheehy, Smith, R., Vitale, Young.

To enact sections 1927.01, 1927.02, 1927.03, and 1927.04 of the Revised Code to permit courts to create veterans treatment courts and to allow courts to divert certain criminal defendants to participate in veterans treatment court.

H. B. No. 410 - Representatives Seitz, Butler.

Cosponsors: Representatives Brinkman, Merrin, Hood, Becker, Brenner, Wiggam, Lang, Retherford, Patton, Blessing, Vitale.

To amend sections 1901.18, 1901.20, 1907.02, 1907.031, 4511.092, 4511.093, 4511.096, 4511.097, 4511.098, 4511.0910, 5747.51, and 5747.53, to enact new sections 4511.099 and 5747.502, and to repeal sections 4511.099, 4511.0915, and 5747.502 of the Revised Code to grant municipal and county courts original and exclusive jurisdiction over any civil action concerning a traffic law violation, to specify that the court require an advance deposit for the filing of specified civil actions by the local authority bringing the civil action, and to modify the reporting requirements and LGF withholding that apply to subdivisions that operate traffic law photomonitoring devices.

H. B. No. 411 - Representatives Seitz, Sykes.

To amend sections 2305.02 and 2743.48 of the Revised Code to modify the state's wrongful imprisonment law.
