INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

To amend sections 2907.01, 2907.31, 2981.02, and 2981.04 and to enact sections 9.74, 2307.66, 2917.211, 3345.49, 4113.90, 4113.91, 4113.92, 4113.93, and 4113.94 of the Revised Code to prohibit the nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images, to require that certain property involved in the offense be criminally forfeited, and to create certain legal rights and employment protections of a victim of the offense.

To amend sections 2901.01 and 2921.33 of the Revised Code to classify resisting arrest as an offense of violence and to increase the penalties for certain resisting arrest offenses.
