INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 537 - Representative McClain.

To enact section 5534.892 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of U.S. Route 30 in Wyandot and Crawford Counties as the "Lt. Harry L. Martin Memorial Highway."

H. B. No. 538 - Representatives Cera, Rogers.
