The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Representative Scherer moved that the House advance to the sixth order of business, being motions and resolutions.

The motion was agreed to.

MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

Representative Scherer moved that **S. B. No. 170**-Senator LaRose, et al., be taken from the calendar and re-referred to the committee on Rules and Reference.

The motion was agreed to without objection.

Representative Scherer moved that the House revert to the second order of business, being introduction of bills.

The motion was agreed to.

On motion of Representative Scherer, the House recessed.

The House met pursuant to recess.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 545 - Representative Arndt.

Cosponsors: Representatives Romanchuk, Schaffer, Riedel, Becker, Hood, Lang, Scherer, Hambley, Patmon.

To amend sections 5739.03 and 5739.121 of the Revised Code to authorize small retailers to remit sales taxes when the retailer receives payment from the purchaser if the payment is received after the purchased item is delivered or the service is provided.

H. B. No. 546 - Representative Patton.

Cosponsors: Representatives Gavarone, Smith, K.

To enact section 3902.30 of the Revised Code to prohibit health benefit plans from treating telemedicine services differently from in-person health care services solely because they are provided as telemedicine services.

H. B. No. 547 - Representative Edwards.

To enact section 145.018 of the Revised Code regarding Public Employees Retirement System service credit for services as a nonteaching school employee of a county board of development disabilities.

H. B. No. 548 - Representative McClain.

Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Thompson, Hood, Hambley, Riedel, Dean, Wiggam, Retherford, Seitz, Lipps.

To amend section 4511.84 of the Revised Code to permit a person to wear earplugs for hearing protection while operating a motorcycle.

H. B. No. 549 - Representative Arndt.

To amend sections 3314.03, 3317.01, 3326.11, and 3328.24 and to enact section 3313.621 of the Revised Code to generally require public and chartered nonpublic schools to open for instruction after Labor Day.

H. B. No. 550 - Representatives Boyd, Boggs.

Cosponsors: Representatives Kelly, Leland, Antonio, Lepore-Hagan, Clyde, Fedor, West, Howse, Miller, Ramos, Celebrezze, Smith, K., Rogers, Patterson, Sheehy, Kent, Sykes, Craig, O'Brien, Brown, Reece, Galonski, Strahorn, Ashford, Boccieri.

To amend sections 4117.10 and 5747.01 and to enact sections 4143.01, 4143.02, 4143.03, 4143.04, 4143.05, 4143.06, 4143.07, 4143.08, 4143.09, 4143.10, 4143.11, 4143.12, 4143.13, 4143.14, and 4143.99 of the Revised Code to establish family and medical leave insurance benefits to provide paid leave to allow an individual to address the individual's own serious health condition, to care for a family member, or to bond with a new child and to exempt those benefits from personal income tax.

H. B. No. 551 - Representatives Perales, Romanchuk.

Cosponsors: Representatives Antani, Arndt, Butler, Green, Kick, Reineke, Retherford, Seitz, Vitale.

To amend sections 4109.05 and 4109.99 and to enact section 4109.22 of the Revised Code regarding hazardous occupations prohibited for minors and providing training to certain minors employed in a construction or manufacturing occupation.

H. B. No. 552 - Representative LaTourette.

Cosponsors: Representatives Hambley, Lanese, Romanchuk.

To amend sections 955.16, 959.06, 4729.01, 4729.531, 4729.532, 4729.54, and 4729.55 and to enact sections 955.151, 959.134, 3719.091, 4729.533, 4729.534, 4729.535, 4729.542, 4729.991, and 4741.201 of the Revised Code to establish requirements governing the chemical capture of animals, prohibit

the use of gas chambers when euthanizing an animal, and to make changes to the law governing euthanasia of an animal by lethal injection.

H. B. No. 553 - Representative Cupp.

Cosponsors: Representatives Butler, Gavarone, Riedel.

To amend section 2921.41 of the Revised Code to expand the increased penalties for theft in office based on the amount of property or services stolen and to include as restitution certain audit costs of the entity that suffered the loss involved in the offense.
