The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Carfagna was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 598 - Representatives West, Green.

Cosponsors: Representatives Thompson, Smith, K., Seitz, Ashford, Scherer.

To amend sections 5722.14 and 5723.04, to enact section 5723.20, and to repeal section 5722.13 of the Revised Code to give county auditors more discretion with respect to how often tax-forfeited land shall be offered for sale, to expressly immunize counties from civil liability in connection with such land, and to remove a requirement that property held by a land bank for more than fifteen years must be offered for sale at a public auction.

H. B. No. 599 - Representative West.

Cosponsors: Representatives Leland, Ashford, Ramos, Brown.

To repeal section 9.68 of the Revised Code to restore local authority to regulate the ownership, possession, purchase, sale, transfer, transportation, storage, and keeping of firearms.

H. B. No. 600 - Representative Barnes.

To enact section 122.863 of the Revised Code to establish the "Access to Global Market Opportunities for Ohio Manufactured Products Program" to be composed of the "Ohio Global Leadership Initiative" and the "Global Initiative on International Relations" to create new, untapped global markets for Ohio businesses and thereby promote job creation, and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 601 - Representative Ginter.

To amend sections 4723.52, 4729.45, 4729.553, 4730.56, and 4731.83 of the Revised Code regarding administration of drugs for drug addiction treatment.

H. B. No. 602 - Representatives Duffey, Lanese.

Cosponsor: Representative Scherer.

To amend sections 5747.50, 5747.51, and 5747.53 and to enact sections 9.662 and 5747.504 of the Revised Code to penalize a municipal corporation for engaging in certain actions related to its provision of water and sewer services outside of its territory by reducing or withholding payments the municipal corporation receives from the Local Government Fund and rendering the municipal corporation ineligible for state water and sewer development funds.

H. B. No. 603 - Representative Perales.

Cosponsors: Representatives Craig, Johnson, Lanese, Kent, O'Brien, Reece, Riedel, Romanchuk.

To amend section 3333.31 of the Revised Code to grant residency status for in-state tuition purposes at state institutions of higher education to all military service members who are on active duty and to their spouses and dependents.

H. B. No. 604 - Representative Strahorn.

Cosponsors: Representatives Antonio, Holmes, Ashford, Boggs, Patterson, Miller, Brown, Craig, O'Brien, West, Smith, K.

To amend sections 4906.20, 4906.201, and 5727.75 of the Revised Code to alter the minimum setback requirement for wind farms of five or more megawatts and to make the authorization of qualified energy project property tax exemptions permanent.

H. B. No. 605 - Representatives Kelly, Smith, K.

Cosponsors: Representatives Craig, Boggs, Howse, Brown, Ingram, West, Sykes, Kent, Miller, Antonio.

To amend sections 119.14 and 4111.03 and to enact sections 4111.031 and 4111.032 of the Revised Code to raise the salary threshold above which certain employees are exempt from the overtime law.

Said bills were considered the first time.

MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

Representative Lang moved that the following resolution be read by title only and brought up for immediate adoption:

H. R. No. 425 - Representative Schuring

Authorizing Ohio TeenPact Leadership School to use the Ohio House Chambers to conduct its graduation ceremonies.
