The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Huffman was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

#### **INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bills were introduced:

**H. B. No. 606 -** Representatives Patterson, LaTourette. Cosponsors: Representatives Boggs, Craig, Ginter, Koehler, O'Brien.

To amend sections 321.24, 929.01, 5713.30, and 5713.34 and to enact section 5709.29 of the Revised Code to authorize a property tax exemption for land used for commercial maple sap extraction and to reimburse, up to \$3 million per year, local governments for revenue lost from the exemption.

H. B. No. 607 - Representative Wiggam.

To amend section 1901.021 of the Revised Code to eliminate the requirement that one of the judges of the Wayne County Municipal Court sit within the municipal corporation of Orrville.

**H. B. No. 608 -** Representative Wiggam. Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Riedel, Schaffer, Hood, Vitale, Retherford, Roegner.

To amend section 5101.54 and to enact sections 5101.545, 5101.546, 5101.547, and 5101.548 of the Revised Code regarding eligibility for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits.

H. B. No. 609 - Representative Hughes.

To amend sections 3313.66, 3313.661, and 5122.10 and to enact sections 3313.669 and 3313.6610 of the Revised Code with respect to the expulsion of a student from a school district, community school, or STEM school for communicating a threat of violence to occur on school grounds.

H. B. No. 610 - Representative Clyde.

Cosponsors: Representatives Boccieri, Boggs, O'Brien, Lepore-Hagan, Ashford, West, Smith, K.

To amend sections 3517.01, 3517.10, 3517.105, 3517.106, 3517.13, and 3599.03 of the Revised Code to modify the Campaign Finance Law.

H. B. No. 611 - Representatives Faber, Roegner.

Cosponsors: Representatives Patterson, Seitz, Becker, Riedel.

To amend section 3314.08 and to enact section 3314.272 of the Revised Code to condition payment from the Department of Education to an Internetor computer-based community school on the school's use of automatically verifiable software that tracks attendance, class size, and participation.

H. B. No. 612 - Representative Perales.

Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Butler, Carfagna, Ginter, Kent, O'Brien, Rezabek, Schaffer, Sheehy.

To amend section 5101.132 and to enact section 109.67 of the Revised Code to require the Attorney General to establish and maintain a publicly accessible child abuse registry containing information on offenders who commit certain offenses against minors under 14 years of age and to name the act Jacob's Law.

Said bills were considered the first time.
