**REPORTS OF REFERENCE AND BILLS FOR SECOND
CONSIDERATION**

Senator Obhof reports for the Standing Committee on Rules and Reference, recommending that the following bills and resolutions, standing in order for second consideration, be referred to committee as recommended:

Am. H. B. No. 8 -Representatives Hambley, Rezabek, et al.

To amend section 149.43 and to enact section 149.436 of the Revised Code to exempt from the Public Records Law certain information concerning a minor that is included in a record related to a traffic accident involving a school vehicle in which the minor was an occupant at the time of the accident and to allow the parent or guardian of the minor to request a record of the accident containing the exempted information.

To the Committee on Local Government, Public Safety and Veterans Affairs.

Am. H. B. No. 46 -Representative Sprague, et al.

To amend section 135.35 of the Revised Code to modify the qualifications regarding notes eligible for investment of county inactive moneys.

To the Committee on Government Oversight and Reform.

Sub. H. B. No. 63 -Representative Hughes, et al.

To amend sections 2903.11, 2929.01, 2929.13, and 2929.14 and to enact section 2941.1425 of the Revised Code to require an additional prison term of 6 years for felonious assault if the offender also is convicted of a specification that charges that the offender used an accelerant in committing the offense and that the harm caused by the violation resulted in a permanent, serious disfigurement or permanent, substantial incapacity and to name the act's provisions "Judy's Law."

Sub. H. B. No. 68 -Representative Anielski, et al.

To amend sections 2907.321, 2907.322, 2907.323, 2929.13, and 2929.14 of the Revised Code to include conduct involving an impaired person within the offenses of pandering obscenity involving a minor, pandering sexually oriented matter involving a minor, and illegal use of a minor in a nudity-oriented material or performance.

To amend section 3772.03 and to enact sections 3774.01, 3774.02, 3774.03, 3774.04, 3774.05, 3774.06, 3774.07, 3774.08, and 3774.09 of the Revised Code to grant the Ohio Casino Control Commission the authority to regulate fantasy contests and to exempt fantasy contests from the gambling laws.

S. B. No. 157 -Senator Bacon

To enact sections 4781.401, 5311.082, 5321.061, 5325.01, 5325.02, 5325.021, 5325.04, 5325.05, 5325.06, 5325.07, 5325.08, 5325.081, 5325.09, 5325.10, 5325.13, 5325.14, 5325.15, 5325.17, and 5325.18 of the Revised Code to regulate the reselling of public utility service.

To amend sections 9.63 and 5747.502 of the Revised Code to withhold local government fund payments to municipal corporations that have enacted an ordinance, policy, directive, rule, or resolution that hinders or prevents municipal employees from cooperating with state or federal immigration services or from complying with executive orders pertaining to immigration.

To amend section 135.35 of the Revised Code to modify the qualifications regarding notes eligible for investment of county inactive moneys.

To amend section 3701.79 and to enact sections 2919.10 and 2919.101 of the Revised Code to prohibit a person from performing, inducing, or attempting to perform or induce an abortion on a pregnant woman who is seeking the abortion because an unborn child has or may have Down Syndrome.
