**REPORTS OF REFERENCE AND BILLS FOR SECOND
CONSIDERATION**

Senator Obhof reports for the Standing Committee on Rules and Reference, recommending that the following bills and resolutions, standing in order for second consideration, be referred to committee as recommended:

Sub. H. B. No. 131 -Representatives Gavarone, Reineke, et al.

To amend section 4755.40 of the Revised Code to modify the laws governing the practice of physical therapy.

To the Committee on Health, Human Services and Medicaid.

H. B. No. 135 -Representative Patmon, et al.

To enact section 5.49 of the Revised Code to designate June 12th as "Superman Day."

To the Committee on Government Oversight and Reform.

Sub. H. B. No. 263 -Representative Lanese, et al.

To enact section 3717.14 of the Revised Code to authorize a food service operation or retail food establishment to allow a person to bring a dog in an outdoor dining area of the establishment or operation under specified conditions.

To the Committee on Health, Human Services and Medicaid.

Am. Sub. H. B. No. 318 -Representatives Patterson, LaTourette, et al.

To enact section 3313.951 of the Revised Code with regard to school resource officers, to require the Facilities Construction Commission to study and report on school building security upgrades and school resource officers, and to make an appropriation.

To the Committee on Finance.

Sub. H. B. No. 360 -Representative Greenspan, et al.

To amend sections 2903.31, 3301.22, 3313.66, 3313.661, 3313.666, 3314.03, and 3326.11 and to enact sections 3313.669, 3319.318, and 3345.19 of the Revised Code to enact the "Ohio Anti-Bullying and Hazing Act" with regard to school discipline and bullying and hazing policies at public schools and colleges.

Sub. H. B. No. 378 -Representatives Smith, R., Cera, et al.

To amend section 184.10 and to enact sections 122.97, 122.971, 122.972, 122.973, 122.974, 122.975, 122.976, 122.977, 122.978, 122.979, 122.9710, 122.9711, 122.9712, 122.9713, and 5511.11 of the Revised Code to create the Ohio Broadband Development Grant Program, to encourage the Department of Transportation to work with telecommunications providers to lay fiber optic cable, and to make an appropriation.

To the Committee on Finance.

Sub. H. B. No. 489 -Representative Dever, et al.

To amend sections 1101.05, 1109.20, 1121.10, 1125.23, 1181.08, 1322.01, 1322.07, 1322.09, 1322.12, 1322.34, 1322.40, 1322.50, 1733.01, 1733.04, 1733.05, 1733.32, and 5726.04 and to enact sections 103.31, 1121.101, 1121.61, 1349.72, 1733.328, 1733.441, and 1733.53 of the Revised Code to provide some regulatory and tax relief to state banks and credit unions, to provide for data analytics to be conducted on publicly available information regarding banks, credit unions, and consumer finance companies, to require registration of mortgage loan servicers, and to require a specified notice be given to a debtor for certain debt collection.

To enact sections 5534.751 and 5534.809 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 93 in Tuscarawas County as the "PFC Oscar F. Nicewander Memorial Highway" and a portion of State Route 520 in Holmes County as the "Cpl. Jerry Robert Spitler Memorial Highway."

To amend section 742.63 and to enact section 124.824 of the Revised Code to revise the payments that surviving family members receive from the Ohio Public Safety Officers Death Benefit Fund and to permit surviving spouses and children to participate in the health, dental, and vision benefits offered to state employees as if the survivors were employees of this state.
