## A BILL

To enact section 182.01 of the Revised Code to	1
create the Loving State Index and the Loving	2
State Index Commission to evaluate and rank	3
municipal corporations in Ohio regarding	4
critical supports that are vital to student	5
academic success in order to identify gaps in	6
opportunity for low-income individuals and	7
minority individuals.	8

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 182.01 of the Revised Code be	9
enacted to read as follows:	10
Sec. 182.01. (A) There is hereby created the loving state	11
index commission. The commission shall do all of the following:	12
(1) Establish a system to evaluate and rank municipal	13
corporations in this state regarding critical supports that are	14
vital to student academic success in order to identify gaps in	15
opportunity for low-income individuals and minority individuals.	16
The system shall be known as the loving state index.	17
(2) Establish criteria to evaluate the following factors	18

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for purposes of division (A) of this section:	19
(a) Early childhood education participation;	20
(b) Preschool suspension alternatives;	21
(c) Gifted classes offered for kindergarten through grade	22
eight;	23
(d) Suspension and expulsion alternatives for kindergarten through grade twelve;	24 25
(e) Advanced high school curriculum;	26
(f) Advanced placement curricula;	27
(g) Anti-bullying;	28
(h) School-to-prison alternatives;	29
(i) Well-resourced schools;	30
(j) Experienced teachers;	31
(k) In-school support staff;	32
(1) Economically integrated schools;	33
(m) Access to health insurance;	34
(n) Prenatal health services;	35
(o) Access to mental health services;	36
(p) Access to healthy food;	37
(q) Clean air environments;	38
(r) Access to parks;	39
(s) Youth safety;	40
(t) Access to public transportation;	41

<u>(u) Affordable housing;</u>	42

(3) Use data from the primary or largest school district	46
in each municipal corporation in which multiple school districts	47
<u>exist.</u>	48
(4) Not later than July 1, 2021, and annually thereafter,	49
publish and submit to the members of the general assembly a	50
report containing the commission's evaluation and ranking of	51
municipal corporations. The report shall be available online via	52
the web sites of the departments of education, health, commerce,	53
natural resources, environmental protection services, and	54
transportation, JobsOhio, and the governor's office of faith-	55
based and community initiatives. The report shall contain	56
information regarding the scoring strategy, data, and analysis	57
the commission used.	58
(B) The commission consists of the following eight	59
members:	60
(1) The superintendent of public instruction or the	61
superintendent's designee;	62
(2) The director of health or the director's designee;	63
(3) The director of commerce or the director's designee;	64
(4) The director of natural resources or the director's	65
designee;	66
(5) The director of environmental protection or the	67
<u>director's designee;</u>	68

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(6) The director of transportation or the director's	69
<u>designee;</u>	70
(7) The chief investment officer of JobsOhio or the	71
officer's designee;	72
(8) The executive director of the governor's office of	73
faith-based and community initiatives or the director's	74
designee.	75
(C) The commission shall select from its membership a	76
chairperson. The members of the commission shall serve without	77
compensation, but shall be reimbursed for the actual and	78
necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official	79
<u>duties.</u>	80
(D) Political subdivisions shall provide data to the	81
commission upon request unless the data is exempt from	82
disclosure as a public record under section 149.43 of the	83
Revised Code.	84
(E) For purposes of this section:	85
"Political subdivision" means any county, township,	86
municipal corporation, public school, city or general health	87
district, alcohol, drug addiction, and mental health services	88
board, or other body corporate and politic that is responsible	89
for government activities in a geographic area smaller than the	90
<u>state.</u>	91
"Public school" means a school district created under	92
Chapter 3311., community school created under Chapter 3314.,	93
STEM school created under Chapter 3326., or college-preparatory	94
boarding school created under Chapter 3328. of the Revised Code.	95

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
