BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.509 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495,	10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911,	11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

39 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 47 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 48 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 49

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and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 51 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 52 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 53 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 54 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 55 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 56 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 57 directly to their clients. 58

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar69receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the70St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for71its research and other programs.72

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar73receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to74special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions75for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.76

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar77receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the78

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children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 79 contributions for its research and other programs. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 82 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 83 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 84 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 87 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 88 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 89 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 92 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 93 contributions into its general account to be used for 94 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 95 America foundation. 96

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 97 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 98 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 99 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 100 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions received102pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio103cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for104scholarships and other educational activities.105

The registrar shall pay the contributions received106pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the107

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organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 108 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 109 that organization. 110 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 111 pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 112 aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 113 facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 114 programming. 115 The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 116 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 117 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 118 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 119 section. A university or college that receives contributions 120 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 121 scholarship fund. 122 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 123 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 124 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 125 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 126 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 127

receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 128 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 129 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 130 funds as provided in this section. 131

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 132 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 133 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 134 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 135 cyclists of all ages. 136 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar137receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the138"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial,139incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws140of this state, to assist that organization in paying the141expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable,142educational, and cultural events at the monument.143

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 144 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 145 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 146 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 147 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar149receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the150Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the151contributions only to promote and support the football team of152Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 162 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 163 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 164 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 165 activities. 166

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 167 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 168 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 169 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 170 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 171 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 174 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 175 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 176 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 177 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 178 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 179 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 180 the improvement of patient outcomes. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 183 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 184 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 185 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 186 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 187 personnel, veterans, and their families. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 190 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 191 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 192 families. 193

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar194receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the195pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions196

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into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 197 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 198 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 199 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 200 destination. 201

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 207 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 208 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 209 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 210 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 211 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 212 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 213 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 214 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 215 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 216 217 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar218receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the219rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.220

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 221 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 222 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 223 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 224 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 225 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 226

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charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 227
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 228
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 229
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 230
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 231
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 232
under this section. 233

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 234 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 235 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 236 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 237 programs. 238

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar239receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the240western reserve historical society, which shall use the241contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.242

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar243receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the244Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple245negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the246contributions for charitable and educational purposes.247

248 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 249 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 250 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 251 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 252 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 253 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 254 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 255 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 256 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the257registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which258such payments are to be made.259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 261 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 262 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 263 river watershed. 264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar265receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to266Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute267to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.268

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 269 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 270 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 271 the money in support of the park. 272

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar273receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the274Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the275contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar277receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the278girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the279contributions to support the activities of the organization.280

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 281 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 282 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 283 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 284 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 285 local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar287receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the288national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the289contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace290legends to inspire future leaders.291

292 The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 293 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 294 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 295 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 296 commission and that is participating in the license plate 297 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 298 of the county of residence of an applicant. 299

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 300 contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 301 the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 302 that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 303 participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 304 (G) of that section. 305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 306 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 307 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 308 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 309 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 310 Ohio and for educational programs. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar312receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to313pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of314

supporting cancer research.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 317 318 Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 319 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 320 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 321 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 322 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 325 great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 326 America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 327 equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl scouts. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 330 receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 331 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 332 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 333 334 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335 receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 336 Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 337 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 339 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 340 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 341 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 342 charitable purposes. 343

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 345 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 346 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 347 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 350 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 351 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 352 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 353 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 354 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions received356pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio357concerns of police survivors, which shall use those358contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate359to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed360in the line of duty.361

The registrar shall pay the contributions received362pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater363Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those364contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in365the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 368 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 369 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 370 families. 371

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 373 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 374 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 375 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 376 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 377 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 378 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 379 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 380 381 participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386 receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 387 Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 388 contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 389 of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391 receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 392 Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 393 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 394 Cleveland, Ohio. 395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 396 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 397 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 398 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 399 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 400 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 401 resides. 402

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403 receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 404 Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 405 contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 406 law enforcement education and assistance. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar408receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the409Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the410moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section4114503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written412agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 415 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 416 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 417 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 418 rotary foundation. 419

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar420receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the421Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the422contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained423under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.424

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar425receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to426buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the427contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar429receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the430Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and431

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connection. 433 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 434 receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 435 Medina county historical society, which shall use those 436 contributions to distribute between the various historical 437 societies and museums in Medina county. 438 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 439 receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 440 Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 441 contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 442 scholarship purposes. 443 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444 receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 445 Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 446 447 research projects. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 448 receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 449 Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 450 451 contributions solely to promote and support the historical preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 452

maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar454receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the455Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those456contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth457baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar459receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the460

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Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 461 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 462 providing services to the school district's students that assist 463 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 464 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 465 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 466 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 467 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 468 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 469 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 470 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 471 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 472 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 473 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 474 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 475 training in providing such services to the students of the 476 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 477 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 478 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 479 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 480 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar482receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the483Canton city school district. The district may use the484contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the485contributions for any political purpose or to pay salaries of486district employees.487

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar488receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to489Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal490corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the491

contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 492 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 493 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 494 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 495 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 496 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 497 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 498 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 499 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 500 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 501 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 502 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 503 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 504 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 505 services.
