**Sub. S. B. No. 47 – Senator Eklund**

To amend sections 2929.17, 2953.32, and 2953.36 and to enact section 2950.151 of the Revised Code to create a procedure for certain offenders convicted of unlawful sexual conduct with a minor to petition a court for reclassification or removal from duties under the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Law and to permit record sealing in those cases.

(Committee on Judiciary recommends passage of substitute bill April 10, 2019)

To amend section 2933.32 of the Revised Code to authorize a corrections officer to cause a body cavity search to be conducted or to conduct a strip search and to establish separate rules for conducting strip searches.

**Sub. S. B. No. 103 – Senators Dolan, Yuko**

To amend section 1901.181 of the Revised Code to grant the Housing Division of the Cleveland Municipal Court jurisdiction in any review or appeal of a final order of an administrative body that relates to a local building, health, or safety code and concurrent jurisdiction with the Court of Common Pleas in criminal cases related to environmental pollution.

(Committee on Judiciary recommends passage of substitute bill November 6, 2019)

To amend section 2923.126 of the Revised Code to grant civil immunity to nonprofit corporations for certain injuries, deaths, or losses resulting from the carrying of handguns.
