INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 87 - Representative Antani.

To amend section 2953.61 of the Revised Code to allow for the sealing of charges dismissed through intervention in lieu of conviction when those charges are connected to a conviction for operating a vehicle under the influence.

H. B. No. 88 - Representative Antani.

To amend sections 4503.03 and 4511.75 of the Revised Code to enhance the penalties for failing to properly stop for a school bus, to establish requirements related to informing the public about that prohibition, and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 90 - Representative Antani.

Cosponsors: Representatives Riedel, Becker.

To amend sections 3314.03, 3326.11, and 3328.24 and to enact sections 3301.0730, 3708.01, 3708.02, 3708.03, 3708.05, 3708.07, 3708.09, 3708.11, 3708.13, 3708.15, 3708.17, and 3708.19 of the Revised Code to require the development of an instructional program and educational and informational materials and the dissemination of those materials to protect the humanity of the unborn child and to make an appropriation.
