The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Kick was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 98 - Representatives Jones, Cera. Cosponsors: Representatives Edwards, Riedel, Stein, Cross, Smith, R., West,

Miller, A., Patterson, Wilkin, Hillyer.

To enact section 122.26 of the Revised Code to reinstate the rural industrial park loan fund and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 99 - Representatives Cera, Rogers. Cosponsors: Representatives West, Kelly, Riedel, Ingram, Hambley, Miller, A., O'Brien, Crossman.

To amend sections 323.152 and 4503.065 of the Revised Code to raise the homestead exemption income eligibility to \$60,000 and increase the tax reduction.

H. B. No. 100 - Representative Cera.

Cosponsor: Representative Patterson.

To amend section 5301.56 of the Revised Code to revise the requirements governing abandoned mineral rights.

H. B. No. 101 - Representative Cera.

Cosponsors: Representatives Leland, Miller, J., Ingram, Sweeney, Crawley, O'Brien, Smith, K.

To amend sections 511.27, 1545.21, 3501.01, 3503.16, 3513.01, 3513.12, and 3513.262 of the Revised Code to require presidential primary elections to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May.

H. B. No. 102 - Representative Lipps.

To amend section 5162.06 and to enact sections 5164.061 and 5167.15 of the Revised Code regarding Medicaid coverage of chiropractic services.

H. B. No. 103 - Representatives Lepore-Hagan, Manning, D. Cosponsors: Representatives Boyd, Brent, Galonski, O'Brien, Skindell, Upchurch.

To amend sections 1343.01, 3781.10, 5313.02, and 5313.04 and to enact sections 5313.021, 5313.022, 5313.031, and 5313.12 of the Revised Code to make changes to the law relating to land installment contracts.

H. B. No. 104 - Representative Stein.

Cosponsors: Representatives Arndt, Becker, Carfagna, Cupp, Dean, Hambley, Hood, Koehler, Lang, LaTourette, Lipps, Manning, G., McClain, Riedel, Romanchuk, Seitz, Wiggam, Wilkin.

To amend sections 3748.03, 5725.98, 5726.98, 5729.98, 5747.02, 5747.98, and 5751.98 and to enact sections 122.97, 3748.23, 4164.01, 4164.02, 4164.05, 4164.07, 4164.09, 4164.11, 4164.13, 4164.15, 4164.17, 4164.19, 4164.21, 4164.25, 4164.27, 4164.29, 4164.33, 4164.35, 4164.41, 4164.43, 4164.45, 4164.46, 4164.48, 4164.50, 4164.52, 4164.58, 4164.59, 4164.63, 4164.71, and 4164.73 of the Revised Code to enact the Advanced Nuclear Technology Helping Energize Mankind (ANTHEM) Act by establishing the Ohio Nuclear Development Authority and the Ohio Nuclear Development Consortium and authorizing tax credits for investments therein.

To amend sections 4510.036 and 4511.75 of the Revised Code to enhance the penalty for failing to stop for a school bus that is picking up or dropping off school children when the offender has a prior violation within a five-year period.

H. B. No. 106 - Representatives Scherer, Sheehy.

To amend sections 4507.01, 4507.05, 4507.071, 4507.09, 4507.23, 4510.17, 4510.31, and 4511.043 of the Revised Code to revise the minimum age at which a minor may obtain a probationary driver's license and to make other changes to the laws governing the issuance and possession of a temporary instruction permit and probationary driver's license.

H. B. No. 107 - Representatives Brown, Lipps.

Cosponsors: Representatives Leland, Riedel, Upchurch, Kelly, Kick, Smith, K., Crossman, West, Miller, A., Lightbody.

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 4503.942 of the Revised Code to create the "Zero" license plate to benefit the nonprofit Zero, the End of Prostate Cancer.

Said bills were considered the first time.

To amend section 2923.11 of the Revised Code to correct a drafting error in the definition of "dangerous ordnance" that resulted from Am. Sub. H.B. 228 of the 132nd General Assembly and to declare an emergency, was taken up for consideration the third time.

The question being, "Shall the emergency clause stand as part of the bill?"

Representative Cross moved that **Am. H. B. No. 86-**Representative Plummer, et al., be informally passed and retain its place on the calendar.

The motion was agreed to without objection.
