The House met pursuant to adjournment.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 136 - Representative Hillyer.

Cosponsors: Representatives Seitz, Weinstein, Crawley.

To amend sections 2929.02, 2929.022, 2929.024, 2929.03, 2929.04, 2929.06, 2953.21, and 2953.23 and to enact section 2929.025 of the Revised Code to prohibit imposing the death penalty for aggravated murder when the offender had a serious mental illness at the time of the offense.

H. B. No. 137 - Representatives Kelly, Vitale.

Cosponsors: Representatives Galonski, Sheehy, Miranda, Patterson, O'Brien, Boggs, Riedel, Becker, West, Smith, K., Crossman, Brown, Upchurch, Ingram, Rogers, Weinstein, Seitz, Strahorn, Lightbody, Denson.

To enact section 4113.14 of the Revised Code to require an employer to provide earnings and deductions statements to each of the employer's employees.

H. B. No. 138 - Representative Rogers.

To amend section 727.14 of the Revised Code to increase from \$250 to \$500 the estimated cost of certain special assessments for which a municipal corporation must provide notice to affected property owners.

H. B. No. 139 - Representative Patton.

To amend sections 4511.092 and 4511.093 of the Revised Code to prohibit a municipal corporation or township that does not operate either a fire department or an emergency medical services organization from utilizing traffic law photo-monitoring devices.

H. B. No. 140 - Representative Patton.

To amend section 4511.093 of the Revised Code to prohibit a local authority with a population of 200 or fewer from utilizing traffic law photomonitoring devices.

H. B. No. 141 - Representative Patton.

To amend section 4511.093 of the Revised Code to prohibit a local authority, in any year, from issuing a total number of traffic tickets based on the use of traffic law photo-monitoring devices that exceeds two times the population of the local authority.

H. B. No. 142 - Representative Patton.

To amend section 4511.093 of the Revised Code to prohibit a local authority from deriving more than 30 per cent of the total annual revenue of the local authority from the issuance of tickets for traffic law violations based on evidence recorded by traffic law photo-monitoring devices.

H. B. No. 143 - Representatives Keller, Cera.

Cosponsors: Representatives Zeltwanger, LaTourette, Edwards, Patterson, Plummer, Riedel, Schaffer, Smith, K., O'Brien, Koehler, Carfagna, Lang, Vitale, Smith, T., Hood, Manchester, Carruthers, Sweeney, Wiggam, Dean, Hoops, Brent.

To amend sections 5747.08 and 5747.98 and to enact section 5747.31 of the Revised Code to grant income tax credits to persons who serve as volunteer peace officers, firefighters, or emergency medical technicians.

H. B. No. 144 - Representative Manning, D.

Cosponsors: Representatives Riedel, Miranda, Russo.

To amend section 3727.53 and to enact section 3727.58 of the Revised Code to prohibit a hospital from requiring a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse to work overtime as a condition of continued employment.

H. B. No. 145 - Representative Brinkman.

Cosponsor: Representative Romanchuk.

To amend section 2953.32 and to enact sections 959.30, 959.31, 959.32, 959.33, and 959.34 of the Revised Code to require the Attorney General to establish an animal abuser registry.

H. B. No. 146 - Representative Brinkman.

Cosponsor: Representative Romanchuk.

To amend sections 959.132 and 959.99 and to enact section 959.30 of the Revised Code to prohibit an animal abuse offender from owning, possessing, having custody of, or residing with a companion animal for a specified time period.

H. B. No. 147 - Representative Brinkman.

To amend sections 4501.27 and 4507.53 of the Revised Code to require the Department of Public Safety, including the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, to place an image of the Bureau's seal or emblem in a corner of a photograph or digital image of a person, under certain circumstances.

H. B. No. 148 - Representative Brinkman.

To amend section 4511.44 and to enact section 4511.433 of the Revised Code to require drivers to yield the right of way to any other vehicle that is parking in or exiting an angled or parallel parking space on a public road.

H. B. No. 149 - Representative Merrin.

Cosponsors: Representatives Lang, Riedel, Romanchuk, Seitz, Becker, Schaffer, Reineke.

To enact section 5709.51 of the Revised Code to enact the "Affordable Homebuilding and Housing Act" to temporarily exempt from property tax the increased value of land subdivided for residential development.

H. B. No. 150 - Representative Merrin.

To amend sections 1121.29, 5726.01, and 5726.04 of the Revised Code to enact the Community Bank Tax Relief Act to reduce the highest financial institutions tax rate, exempt newly formed banks for their first three years, limit the tax base for highly capitalized institutions, and to limit the application fees charged by the Superintendent of Financial Institutions for approval to incorporate a state bank.
