INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 155 - Representatives Schaffer, Rogers.

Cosponsors: Representatives Romanchuk, Becker, Smith, K., Riedel, Ginter, Perales, Miller, A., Manning, G., Weinstein, West.

To amend section 149.30 and to enact section 155.28 of the Revised Code to prohibit a war relic located on public property or cemetery association property from being sold, disturbed, or otherwise disposed of, except under certain circumstances, and to designate this act as the "Ohio Veterans' Heritage Protection Act."

H. B. No. 156 - Representative Schaffer.

Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Lang, Hood, Ginter, Seitz.

To amend section 2923.126 of the Revised Code to grant civil immunity to nonprofit corporations and persons associated with them for certain injuries, deaths, or losses resulting from the carrying of handguns.

H. B. No. 157 - Representative Greenspan.

To amend sections 131.44 and 131.51 and to enact section 131.52 of the Revised Code to use some surplus state revenue to help counties fund adult protective and senior services.

H. B. No. 158 - Representative Blessing.

To amend section 4509.101 of the Revised Code to waive the fee for filing a petition for limited driving privileges for an individual who qualifies as indigent and whose license is suspended as a result of failure to maintain proof of financial responsibility, and to authorize a court to grant such limited driving privileges on a first offense.

H. B. No. 159 - Representative Blessing.

Cosponsor: Representative Seitz.

To enact section 153.81 of the Revised Code to regulate the use of indemnity provisions in professional design contracts related to public improvements.
