INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 182 - Representative Becker.

Cosponsors: Representatives Vitale, Keller, Cross, Stoltzfus, Zeltwanger, Manchester, Schaffer, Antani, Dean, Ginter, Wiggam, Kick, Riedel, Brinkman, Hood, Jones, McClain, Hoops, Jordan.

To amend sections 9.04, 1739.05, and 5101.56 and to enact sections 1751.95 and 3923.591 of the Revised Code to prohibit insurers from offering coverage for abortion services.

H. B. No. 183 - Representatives Manchester, Patterson.

Cosponsor: Representative Cross.

To amend sections 5747.02 and 5747.98 and to enact sections 901.61 and 5747.72 of the Revised Code to allow income tax credits for beginning farmers who participate in a financial management program and for businesses that sell or rent agricultural land, livestock, facilities, or equipment to beginning farmers.

Said bills were considered the first time.

In memory of Dixie J. Allen.

WHEREAS, The members of the House of Representatives of the 133rd General Assembly of Ohio were deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Dixie J. Allen and extend our heartfelt condolences to her family and friends; and

WHEREAS, Dixie Allen left an indelible impression on the people whose lives she touched, and she will be remembered as a spirited woman who contributed immeasurably to the world around her. A civilian employee in the data automation and personnel management fields for the U.S. Air Force at Wright-Patterson, Los Angeles, and Andrews air force bases, she was appointed to the Ohio House of Representatives in 1998 and elected to the post later that year, and over the course of her four terms, she served on such committees as Financial Institutions, Real Estate and Securities, Finance and Appropriations, and Education, as well as the Human Services Subcommittee of Finance and Appropriations. In 2006, she was elected to serve as a member of the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners, and she was active with numerous organizations, including Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Women in Leadership, the Ohio Legislative Black Caucus, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, and the NAACP; and

WHEREAS, Dixie Allen's regard for improving the quality of life in our society was clearly evident in her personal sacrifices of time and effort to her family, friends, and community. Giving generously of her energy and abilities in all of her endeavors, she displayed exceptional concern and insight, and her absence will be keenly felt; and

WHEREAS, A loving wife to her husband, Jimmy, a devoted mother to her children, and a doting grandmother to her grandchildren and great-grandchildren, Dixie Allen always used her talents to the benefit of others, and the laurels of her life stand as a tribute not only to her but also to those she left behind. Although the void her death has created can never be filled, the legacy of care and commitment she established will surely live on. The world is a richer place for her having been in it, and she will be sorely missed; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the House of Representatives of the 133rd General Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, express a profound sense of loss and sincere regret at the death of Dixie J. Allen and, in so doing, pay tribute to the memory of a truly unique public servant; and be it further

To amend section 127.19 and to enact sections 109.47, 120.56, 127.20,

307.451, 307.452, and 307.453 of the Revised Code to allow the Controlling Board to transfer money to the Attorney General and State Public Defender to defray county costs associated with certain capital cases and to declare an emergency, was taken up for consideration the third time.

The question being, "Shall the emergency clause stand as part of the bill?"
