To amend sections 4758.20 and 4758.42 of the Revised Code to revise the requirements for a chemical dependency counselor II license.

H. B. No. 366 - Representatives Miranda, Plummer.

To amend section 2905.05 of the Revised Code to revise the general prohibition against criminal child enticement.

H. B. No. 367 - Representatives Miranda, Manchester.

Cosponsors: Representatives Smith, K., Riedel, Russo, Galonski, Lepore-Hagan, Weinstein, Lightbody, Patterson, West, Ingram, Carfagna, O'Brien, Kelly, Miller, J., Rogers, Clites, Crawley.

To enact section 3319.091 of the Revised Code to require the Department of Education to make recommendations for a job description for school counselors and to designate at least one staff member as a school counselor liaison.
