Federation of Independent Business, and the American Legislative Exchange Council. Indeed, the world is a richer place not only for his having been in it but also for the legacy of progress he left; and

WHEREAS, Cooper Snyder's perpetual generosity permeated his relationships, and upon reflection, it is easy to see why he found such pride and warmth in the circle of his family members, who not only supported his success but also inspired it. I am writing to inform you that I am offering my resignation as a member of the Ohio House of Representatives, effective at 11:59pm on November 12th, 2019.
