A pastor retired from Zion United Church of Christ, he gave generously of his energy and abilities in all of his endeavors, and he displayed exceptional concern and insight. His absence will be keenly felt; and

WHEREAS, A loving husband to his wife, Melissa, and a devoted father to his daughters, Emily and Hannah, Jon Peterson always used his talents to the benefit of others, and the laurels of his life stand as a tribute not only to him but also to those he left behind. Although the void his death has created can never be filled, the legacy of care and commitment he established will surely live on. The world is a richer place for his having been in it, and he will be sorely missed; therefore be it
