The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Green was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 671 - Representatives Abrams, Stephens.

To amend sections 101.35, 3709.20, 3709.21, and 3709.99 and to enact sections 9.79, 101.36, 3701.145, and 3709.212 of the Revised Code to establish limits on certain public health orders issued by boards of health and the Department of Health, to prohibit a licensing authority from taking disciplinary action against a licensee for engaging in permitted activities during a pandemic, and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 672 - Representatives Leland, Sobecki.

Cosponsors: Representatives Smith, K., Boyd, Howse, Skindell, Sweeney, Crossman, Boggs, Lightbody, Brown, Liston, Russo, Kent, Miranda, Kelly, Ingram, Denson, Galonski, Weinstein, Hicks-Hudson, Sheehy, West, Miller, J., Lepore-Hagan, O'Brien, Patterson, Brent, Miller, A., Sykes, Upchurch, Crawley, Blair, Clites, Strahorn, Robinson, Rogers.

To amend section 4141.29 and to enact section 4141.294 of the Revised Code to enact the "Worker Protection Act" to require the Director of Job and Family Services to consider certain factors related to COVID-19 when determining, for purposes of unemployment benefit eligibility, whether an individual had just cause to quit work or refuse employment and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 673 - Representative Roemer.

To amend section 4729.41 and to enact sections 4713.351 and 4729.42 of the Revised Code and to amend Section 30 of H.B. 197 of the 133rd General Assembly regarding the operation of businesses, practice of certain professions, and completion of education as it relates to COVID-19 and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 674 - Representative Hillyer.

To amend sections 3717.22, 3717.42, 4301.03, 4301.171, 4301.22,

4301.24, 4301.32, 4301.322, 4301.33, 4301.332, 4301.333, 4301.334, 4301.35, 4301.353, 4301.355, 4301.356, 4301.36, 4301.362, 4301.365, 4301.366, 4301.37, 4301.39, 4301.403, 4301.404, 4301.82, 4301.99, 4303.021, 4303.15, 4303.171, 4303.181, 4303.184, 4303.19, 4303.202, 4303.203, 4303.204, 4303.205, 4303.30, and 4303.99; to enact new section 4303.182 and sections 4301.011, 4301.245, 4301.246, 4303.2011, 4303.221, and 4303.222; and to repeal sections 4301.351, 4301.354, 4301.361, 4301.364, and 4303.182 of the Revised Code to revise specified provisions of the liquor control law and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 675 - Representatives Hillyer, Swearingen.

To amend sections 122.65, 122.658, and 151.40 of the Revised Code relating to the Clean Ohio Program and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 676 - Representative Jordan.

To enact sections 196.01, 196.02, 196.03, 196.04, and 196.05 of the Revised Code to create twelve regional State and Local Government Accountability Appeal Boards and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 677 - Representative Powell.

To enact section 5534.416 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of I-75 in Miami County as the "Ohio State Highway Patrol MCEI Kimra Skelton Memorial Highway."

H. B. No. 678 - Representative Ghanbari.

To enact section 5534.417 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of I-90 in Wood County as the "Sergeant Frederick A. Raby Highway."

H. B. No. 679 - Representatives Fraizer, Holmes, A.

Cosponsors: Representatives Abrams, Butler, Crossman, Patton, Seitz, Swearingen.

To amend sections 3902.30, 4723.94, 4732.33, 5123.60, and 5164.95; to amend, for the purpose of adopting a new section number as indicated in parentheses, section 4731.2910 (4743.09); and to enact sections 3721.60, 4730.60, 4753.20, 4755.90, 4757.50, 4758.80, 4759.20, 5119.368, and 5123.603 of the Revised Code to establish and modify requirements regarding the provision of telehealth services and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 680 - Representative Abrams.

To amend sections 3509.03, 3509.04, 3509.08, 3511.02, 3511.04, and 3511.10 and to enact sections 3501.19, 3701.02, and 3709.212 of the Revised Code to create a procedure to conduct an election entirely by mail in the case of a public health emergency, to modify certain deadlines for absent voting, and to direct the Secretary of State's use of federal CARES Act funds.

Said bills were considered the first time.
