The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 711 - Representative Baldrige.

To amend sections 4765.01, 4765.11, 4765.30, 4765.35, 4765.37, 4765.38, 4765.39, 4765.41, and 4766.01 of the Revised Code regarding the scope of emergency medical services provided by emergency medical service personnel.

H. B. No. 712 - Representatives Sheehy, Hicks-Hudson.

To enact section 109.96 of the Revised Code to require the Attorney General to create a database of information regarding law enforcement officers who have been terminated or resigned under certain circumstances and to require law enforcement agencies to access the database to determine employment eligibility of those officers.

To amend sections 2903.211, 2907.08, 2911.21, and 2911.211 of the Revised Code to prohibit using an unmanned aerial vehicle to commit

trespass, voyeurism, and stalking.

To enact section 2151.316 of the Revised Code regarding the admissibility of statements made by a child during a custodial interrogation.

To enact section 2903.17 of the Revised Code to create the offense of strangulation by a law enforcement officer.

To amend section 124.11 and to enact section 737.061 of the Revised Code to allow the chief of police of a municipal corporation to conduct training schools for prospective law enforcement officers.

To amend sections 124.11 and 124.30 of the Revised Code to allow a police department to fill a vacant position in the classified civil service without a competitive examination.

H. B. No. 719 - Representatives West, Crawley.

To amend section 1.58 and to enact section 109.70 of the Revised Code to allow a sentence that has been imposed for a qualifying offense to be reduced.

H. B. No. 720 - Representatives Ingram, Hicks-Hudson.

To amend sections 9.481, 9.61, 737.08, and 737.22 of the Revised Code to allow a municipal corporation to require its fire chief or chief of police to reside within the municipal corporation during the chief's first five years.

H. B. No. 721 - Representatives Weinstein, Crawley.

To enact section 9.201 of the Revised Code to prohibit a political subdivision from receiving certain property from a military equipment surplus program operated by the federal government and to limit the use of federal funds to purchase equipment.

Said bills were considered the first time.
