The journal of the last legislative day was read and approved.

REPORTS OF REFERENCE AND BILLS FOR SECOND CONSIDERATION

Senator Obhof reports for the standing committee on Rules and Reference, recommending that the following bills and resolution, standing in order for second consideration, be referred to committee as recommended:

Am. H. B. No. 16 -Representative Perales, et al.

To amend section 3333.31 of the Revised Code to grant residency status for in-state college tuition to active duty military service members and their spouses and dependents.

To the Committee on Higher Education.

Sub. H. B. No. 71 -Representatives Scherer, Cera, et al.

To amend sections 1333.11, 1333.12, 1333.14, and 1333.15 and to enact section 1333.13 of the Revised Code regarding cigarette minimum pricing.

To the Committee on Government Oversight and Reform.

Sub. H. B. No. 80 -Representative Oelslager, et al.

To amend sections 4113.21, 4121.01, 4123.01, 4123.026, 4123.038, 4123.46, 4123.51, 4123.52, 4123.56, 4123.58, 4123.65, 4123.66, 4131.03, 4141.01, and 5747.01 and to enact sections 4121.471, 4123.513, and 4177.01 to 4177.06 of the Revised Code to make changes to the Workers' Compensation Law, to create a generally uniform definition of employee for specified labor laws, to prohibit misclassification under those laws, to make appropriations for the Bureau of Workers' Compensation and Department of Public Safety for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, and to provide authorization and conditions for the operation of the Bureau's programs.

Am. Sub. H. B. No. 136 -Representative Hillyer, et al. To amend sections 2929.02, 2929.022, 2929.024, 2929.03, 2929.04,

2929.06, 2941.148, 2953.21, 2953.23, 2971.03, and 2971.07 and to enact section 2929.025 of the Revised Code to prohibit imposing the death penalty for aggravated murder when the offender had a serious mental illness at the time of the offense.

S. R. No. 221 -Senator Antonio, et al.

To call on legislators at the state and federal level and other communities and jurisdictions to support an amendment to the United States Constitution that would abolish corporate personhood and the doctrine of money as speech.

S. B. No. 134 - Senator Gavarone

To amend sections 2743.51, 2903.06, 2903.08, 2929.14, 4510.17, 4511.181, 4511.75, 4511.751, and 4511.76 and to enact section 5.501 of the Revised Code to make changes to the law governing passing a school bus, to create a new offense for vehicular homicide and vehicular assault related to improperly passing a stopped school bus, to make an appropriation, and to designate this the School Bus Safety Act.

To enact section 5.246 of the Revised Code to designate the month of June as "Pride Month."

To amend section 3313.666 and to enact section 2903.23 of the Revised Code to require a tiered disciplinary procedure for and student instruction on preventing harassment, intimidation, or bullying in school and to create the offense of aggravated bullying as a third-degree misdemeanor.

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 4503.568 of the Revised Code to create the "Ohio Bullfrog" license plate.

To amend sections 4549.65 and 5739.01 and to enact sections 4516.01, 4516.02, 4516.03, 4516.04, 4516.05, 4516.06, 4516.07, 4516.08, 4516.09, 4516.10, 4516.11, and 4516.12 of the Revised Code to specify requirements related to peer-to-peer car sharing in Ohio.
