INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

To amend section 4513.62 and to enact section 4505.104 of the Revised Code to allow the owner of a towing service or storage facility to obtain certificates of title to unclaimed motor vehicles ordered into storage by law enforcement.

S. B. No. 316 - Senator Dolan.

To amend Section 812.10 of H.B. 529 of the 132nd General Assembly, to make capital reappropriations for the biennium ending June 30, 2022, and to declare an emergency.

S. B. No. 317 - Senator Coley.

To amend section 109.78 of the Revised Code to expressly exempt, from a requirement that peace officer basic training be obtained, certain employees that a board of education or governing body of a school authorizes to go

armed in a school safety zone within which the board or governing body has authority.
