# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, John Glenn was born on July 18, 1921, in Cambridge,	4
Ohio, in a white clapboard house to father John Herschel Glenn	5
and mother Clara Sproat Glenn on Foster Avenue; and	6
WHEREAS, John Glenn's parents grew up in historic	7
Cambridge, Ohio, a city internationally recognized for the	8
manufacture of quality glass products and located in the	9
foothills of the Appalachian mountains in southeastern Ohio; and	10
WHEREAS, Annie Glenn was born on February 17, 1920, in	11
Columbus, Ohio, to Dr. Homer and Margaret Castor and soon moved	12
to New Concord, Ohio, where the Castor family and Glenn family	13
would soon become family friends; and	14
WHEREAS, John Glenn and Annie Castor Glenn met as infants	15
in Concord, Ohio, and became best friends; and	16

WHEREAS, John Glenn launched a career of exploration and	17
service to his nation that would take him from a small city in	18
southeast Ohio firmly rooted in America's heartland to the skies	19
and beyond into outer space; and	20
WHEREAS, John Glenn graduated from New Concord High School	21
and attended Muskingum College before enlisting in the Navy and	22
later transferred to the Marine Corps, where he flew one hundred	23
forty-nine missions during World War II and the Korean War; and	24
WHEREAS, John Glenn married his beloved friend Annie Castor	25
Glenn in 1943; and	26
WHEREAS, John Glenn was accepted into the United States	27
space program on February 20, 1962, and piloted the Friendship 7	28
spacecraft around the earth three times, becoming the first	29
American to orbit the earth; and	30
WHEREAS, John Glenn's orbit around the earth inspired other	31
Ohio astronauts, including Neil Armstrong from Wapakoneta, Ohio,	32
who was the first man to walk on the moon and Judith Resnik from	33
Akron, Ohio, who was the second American female astronaut; and	34
WHEREAS, Thanks to the achievements of the Wright brothers,	35
John Glenn, Neil Armstrong, and Judith Resnick, Ohio is known as	36
the birthplace of aviation pioneers; and	37
WHEREAS, John Glenn retired from the Marine Corps as a	38
colonel and became a United States Senator representing Ohio	39
from 1975 to 1999; and	40
WHEREAS, John Glenn sought the democratic party's	41
presidential nomination in 1984; and	42
WHEREAS, After John Glenn's return from space and upon his	43
retirement from the Senate, John and Annie Glenn founded the	44
John Glenn Institute for Public Service and Public Policy at the	45
Ohio State University to improve the quality of public service	46
and encourage young people to pursue careers in government; and	47

Institute at Hollins College in Roanoke, Virginia; and	50	
WHEREAS, Annie Glenn is one of the nation's leading	51	
advocates for Americans with communicative disorders; and	52	
WHEREAS, Annie Glenn has a special interest in programs	53	
aiding children, the elderly, and Americans with communicative	54

WHEREAS, Ohio law designates the seventeenth day of	56	
February as Annie Glenn Communication Disorders Awareness Day;	57

WHEREAS, John Glenn passed away in Columbus, Ohio, on	59	
December 8, 2016, at the age of ninety-five and millions of	60	
Americans mourned the passing of a true American hero; and	61	
WHEREAS, John and Annie Glenn have touched the lives of	62	
millions of Ohioans and Americans; and	63	
WHEREAS, John and Annie Glenn have made our nation a better	64

WHEREAS, John and Annie Glenn have inspired America's	66	
newest generation to achieve its goals and to give back to its	67
