To urge the Congress of the United States to enact

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):	
WHEREAS, The incidence of violence known as hate crimes or	4
crimes motivated by bias poses a serious national problem; and	5
WHEREAS, According to data obtained by the Federal Bureau	6
of Investigation, the incidence of such violence increased in	7
2017; and	8
WHEREAS, In 1990, Congress enacted the Hate Crime	9
Statistics Act (Public Law 101-275; 28 U.S.C. 534 note) to	10
provide the federal government, law enforcement agencies, and	11
the public with data regarding the incidence of hate crime. The	12
Hate Crimes Statistics Act and the Matthew Shepard and James	13
Byrd, Jr. Hate Crimes Prevention Act (division E of Public Law	14
111-84; 123 Stat. 2835) have enabled federal authorities to	15
understand and, where appropriate, investigate and prosecute	16
hate crimes; and	17
WHEREAS, A more complete understanding of the national	18
problem posed by hate crime is in the public interest and	19
supports the federal interest in eradicating bias-motivated	20

violence referenced in 18 U.S. Code 249(b)(1)(C); and	21
WHEREAS, A complete understanding of the national problem	22
posed by hate crimes is hindered by incomplete data from	23
federal, state, and local jurisdictions through the Uniform	24
Crime Reports program authorized under 28 U.S. Code 534, and	25
administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and	26
WHEREAS, Multiple factors contribute to the provision of	27
inaccurate and incomplete data regarding the incidence of hate	28
crime through the Uniform Crime Reports program. A significant	29
contributing factor is the quality and quantity of training that	30
state and local law enforcement agencies receive on the	31
identification and reporting of suspected bias-motivated crimes;	32

WHEREAS, The problem of crimes motivated by bias is	34
sufficiently serious, widespread, and interstate in nature as to	35

WHEREAS, Federal financial assistance with regard to

certain violent crimes motivated by bias enables federal, state,

and local authorities to work together as partners in the

investigation and prosecution of such crimes; now therefore be
