WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States first adopted	4
daylight saving time during World War I to support war	5
industries. In addition, continuous daylight saving time was	6
observed during World War II, referred to as War Time, and	7
during the 1973 oil crisis; and	8
WHEREAS, The benefits of daylight saving time include	9
additional daylight in the evening hours, increased outdoor	10
playtime for the children and youth, expanded economic	11
opportunities, energy savings, improved traffic safety, and	12
crime reduction; and	13
WHEREAS, States are currently precluded from establishing	14
permanent daylight saving time by federal law, which requires	15
the United States Secretary of Transportation to enforce uniform	16
application of that law across all time zones (certain states,	17
such as Arizona, previously opted out of daylight saving time);	18
