BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, As a direct result of the Patient Protection and	3						
Affordable Care Act of 2010 (ACA), the number of non-elderly,	4						
uninsured Americans has decreased by approximately 17 million							
people, from over 44 million in 2010 to just below 27 million in							
2016; and							
WHEREAS, 2017 marked the first year since the ACA's passage	8						
that the number of uninsured people increased rather than	9						
decreased, with nearly 700,000 more uninsured people compared to							
the previous year; and	11						
WHEREAS, Estimates from the Centers for Disease Control and	12						
Prevention (CDC) indicate that roughly 52 million adult	13						
Americans have a preexisting condition that would have resulted							
in them being denied coverage in the individual insurance							
marketplace prior to the enactment of the ACA; and	16						
WHEREAS, The CDC estimates that, prior to the ACA's	17						
WHEREAS, The CDC estimates that, prior to the ACA's coverage expansions, approximately 18% of individual market	17						

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WHEREAS, Before the ACA, 91 million Americans were covered by insurance plans that included lifetime benefit caps, typically \$1 million, and that PricewaterhouseCoopers estimated that there were approximately 20,000 to 25,000 Americans who had exceeded these benefit caps and were ineligible for further coverage; and

WHEREAS, The ACA allowed states to accept federal funding to expand Medicaid and Ohio is one of 37 states to have done so, allowing nearly 10 million Americans to gain coverage; and

WHEREAS, Prior to the Medicaid expansion, 32.4% of Ohioans aged 19 to 64 with family income at or below 138% of the federal poverty level were uninsured in 2012. This figure dropped to 14.1% in 2015, meaning that the Medicaid expansion lowered the uninsured rate of this population by 18.3% in Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Almost one fifth of Ohioans aged 19 to 64, more than 1.26 million people, have participated in the Ohio Medicaid expansion since it began in 2015; and

WHEREAS, Many Medicaid expansion enrollees reported that the Medicaid expansion made it easier for them to work because they were able to obtain care for previously untreated health conditions. In the words of one enrollee: "[Medicaid] allows me to get surgery, which has allowed me to return to work."; and

WHEREAS, The most common reported reasons why Medicaid expansion enrollees unenrolled from Medicaid were:

(1) Household income increased or the respondent got a job(71.1%);

(2) The respondent obtained non-Medicaid health coverage(48.8%); now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of48the State of Ohio hereby reaffirms its support of the Patient49Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010; and be it further50
