BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:				

Section 1. That sections 3313.666 and 3313.667 of the Revised	-/
Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 3313.666. (A) As used in this section, "harassment,	9
intimidation, or bullying" means either of the following:	10
(1) Any intentional written, verbal, or physical act that a	11
student has exhibited toward another particular student more than	12
once and the behavior both:	13
(a) Causes mental or physical harm to the other student;	14
(b) Is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it	15
creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational	16
environment for the other student.	17
(2) Violence within a dating relationship.	18

(B) The board of education of each city, local, exempted	19
village, and joint vocational school district shall establish a	20
policy prohibiting harassment, intimidation, or bullying. The	21
policy shall be developed in consultation with parents, school	22
employees, school volunteers, students, and community members. The	23
policy shall include the following:	24
(1) A statement prohibiting harassment, intimidation, or	25
bullying of any student on school property or at school-sponsored	26
events;	27
(2) A definition of harassment, intimidation, or bullying	28
that shall include the definition in division (A) of this section;	29
(3) A procedure for reporting prohibited incidents;	30
(4) A requirement that school personnel report prohibited	31
incidents of which they are aware to the school principal or other	32
administrator designated by the principal;	33
(5) A requirement that parents or guardians of any student	34
involved in a prohibited incident be notified and, to the extent	35
permitted by section 3319.321 of the Revised Code and the "Family	36
Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974," 88 Stat. 571, 20	37
U.S.C. <del>1232q</del> <u>1232g</u> , as amended, have access to any written reports	38
pertaining to the prohibited incident;	39
(6) A procedure for documenting any prohibited incident that	40
is reported;	41
(7) A procedure for responding to and investigating any	42
reported incident;	43

(8) A strategy for protecting a victim from additional	44
harassment, intimidation, or bullying, and from retaliation	45 46

(9) A disciplinary procedure for any student guilty of	47
harassment, intimidation, or bullying, which shall not infringe on	48

any student's rights under the first amendment to the Constitution	49
of the United States;	50
(10) A requirement that the district administration	51
semiannually provide the president of the district board a written	52
summary of all reported incidents and post the summary on its web	53
site, if the district has a web site, to the extent permitted by	54
section 3319.321 of the Revised Code and the "Family Educational	55
Rights and Privacy Act of 1974," 88 Stat. 571, 20 U.S.C. 1232q	56
1232g, as amended.	57
(C) Each board's policy shall appear in any student	58
handbooks, and in any of the publications that set forth the	59
comprehensive rules, procedures, and standards of conduct for	60
schools and students in the district. Information regarding the	61
policy shall be incorporated into employee training materials.	62
(D) Each board shall require that twice in each school year	63
each student enrolled in the district be provided with	64
age-appropriate instruction on the board's policy, including a	65
discussion of the consequences for violations of the policy. The	66
first instruction shall be presented near the beginning of the	67
school year and the second instruction shall be presented after	68
the first day of January of that school year.	69
Each board also shall require that once each school year a	70
written statement describing the policy and the consequences for	71
violations of the policy be sent to each student's parent along	72
with an acknowledgement of receipt of the statement to be signed	73
by the parent and returned to the student's school. The statement	74
may be sent with regular student report cards.	75
(E) A school district employee, student, or volunteer shall	76
be individually immune from liability in a civil action for	77
damages arising from reporting an incident in accordance with a	78

policy adopted pursuant to this section if that person reports an 79

substantive legal right for any person.
