



## Executive Summary

Right Time, an Ohio LLC, has developed an innovative, patent pending, reliable dynamic risk assessment and performance measure, called the Personal Achievement Score (PAS ®). The PAS ® is a real-time measure of internal offender rehabilitation from adjudication through reintegration. Specifically, it measures how currently receptive an offender is to being rehabilitated, what is necessary to achieve successful individual rehabilitation outcomes, and if any applied interventions have resulted in substantive prosocial changes in offender dynamic personality factors necessary for successful reintegration.

The PAS ® was developed over five years and as a result of a meta-analysis of over 50,000 pages of corrections research linked to reduced recidivism. It is offered in appropriate versions for adult male/female, young adult, and juvenile offenders. Written at a 5<sup>th</sup> grade reading level, it takes 30-60 minutes to complete, can be computer/print administered, requires no training to administer or interpret, and is priced at the cost of a basic urine screen.

The PAS ® works in conjunction with all static risk assessment measures, augmenting (not replacing) the information they provide. Offender responsivity results are conveyed by outlining prioritized evidence-based recommendations in customized reports dictated by stakeholder need, such as: *Judicial* (assistance in sentencing) , *Probation/Parole* (achieving effective supervision), *Case Management* (motivational interviewing and/or service assignment), *Treatment* (outlining specific elements of criminal thinking which need remediation and motivators which need reinforcement to produce behavioral change), *Occupational* (current employability), *Impact* (measured level of offender change over time), and personal strength-based *Offender* (individualized ways to cooperate with the rehabilitation process) formats.

The PAS ® acts as the operative voice of the offender in the rehabilitation process thereby improving outcomes for all concerned. It reliably (at an overall .92 level) identifies what offenders do not customarily have the skills to verbalize – personality constructs/traits necessary to identify and address in order to achieve successful prosocial reintegration.
