	recipient who fails to complete the recipient's	3
	term of enlistment in the National Guard due to	4
	enlistment, warrant, commission, or appointment	5
	in the United States armed forces is not liable	6
	for repayment of the scholarship.	7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5919.34 of the Revised Code be	8
amended to read as follows:	9

(4) "Private institution of higher education" means an	43
Ohio institution of higher education that is nonprofit and has	44
received a certificate of authorization pursuant to Chapter	45
1713. of the Revised Code, that is a private institution exempt	46
from regulation under Chapter 3332. of the Revised Code as	47
prescribed in section 3333.046 of the Revised Code, or that	48
holds a certificate of registration and program authorization	49
issued by the state board of career colleges and schools	50
pursuant to section 3332.05 of the Revised Code.	51
(5) "Tuition" means the charges imposed to attend an	52
institution of higher education and includes general and	53
instructional fees. "Tuition" does not include laboratory fees,	54
room and board, or other similar fees and charges.	55
(B) There is hereby created a scholarship program to be	56
known as the Ohio national guard scholarship program.	57
(C) (1) The adjutant general shall approve scholarships for	58
all eligible applicants. The adjutant general shall process all	59
applications for scholarships for each academic term in the	60
order in which they are received. The scholarships shall be made	61
without regard to financial need. At no time shall one person be	62
placed in priority over another because of sex, race, or	63
religion.	64
(2) The adjutant general shall develop and provide a	65
written explanation that informs all eligible scholarship	66
recipients that the recipient may become ineligible and liable	67
for repayment for an amount of scholarship payments received in	68
accordance with division (G) of this section. The written	69

explanation shall be reviewed by the scholarship recipient	70
before acceptance of the scholarship and before acceptance of an	71
enlistment, warrant, commission, or appointment for a term not	72
less than the recipient's remaining term in the national guard,	73
in the active component of the United States armed forces or the	74
active reserve component of the United States armed forces.	75
(D)(1) Except as provided in divisions (I) and (J) of this	76
section, for each academic term that an eligible applicant is	77
approved for a scholarship under this section and either remains	78
a current member in good standing of the Ohio national guard or	79
is eligible for a scholarship under division (F)(1) of this	80
section, the institution of higher education in which the	81
applicant is enrolled shall, if the applicant's enlistment	82
obligation extends beyond the end of that academic term or if	83
division (F)(1) of this section applies, be paid on the	84
applicant's behalf the applicable one of the following amounts:	85
(a) If the institution is a state institution of higher	86
education, an amount equal to one hundred per cent of the	87
institution's tuition charges;	88
(b) If the institution is a nonprofit private institution	89

(2) A scholarship recipient under this section may

- (3) If a scholarship recipient withdraws from courses prior to the end of an academic term so that the recipient's enrollment for that academic term is less than three credit hours, no scholarship shall be paid on behalf of that person for that academic term. Except as provided in division (F)(3) of this section, if a scholarship has already been paid on behalf of the person for that academic term, the adjutant general shall add to that person's accumulated eligibility units the number of eligibility units for which the scholarship was paid.
- (F) This division applies to any eligible applicant called into active duty on or after September 11, 2001. As used in this division, "active duty" means active duty pursuant to an executive order of the president of the United States, an act of the congress of the United States, or section 5919.29 or 5923.21 of the Revised Code.
- (1) For a period of up to five years from when an individual's enlistment obligation in the Ohio national guard ends, an individual to whom this division applies is eligible for scholarships under this section for those academic terms that were missed or could have been missed as a result of the individual's call into active duty. Scholarships shall not be paid for the academic term in which an eligible applicant's enlistment obligation ends unless an applicant is eligible under this division for a scholarship for such academic term due to previous active duty.
- (2) When an individual to whom this division applies 155 withdraws or otherwise fails to complete courses, for which 156 scholarships have been awarded under this section, because the 157

individual was called into active duty, the institution of	158
higher education shall grant the individual a leave of absence	159
from the individual's education program and shall not impose any	160
academic penalty for such withdrawal or failure to complete	161
courses. Division (F)(2) of this section applies regardless of	162
whether or not the scholarship amount was paid to the	163
institution of higher education.	164
(3) If an individual to whom this division applies	165

- (3) If an individual to whom this division applies withdraws or otherwise fails to complete courses because the individual was called into active duty, and if scholarships for those courses have already been paid, either:
- (a) The adjutant general shall not add to that person's accumulated eligibility units calculated under division (E) of this section the number of eligibility units for the academic courses or term for which the scholarship was paid and the institution of higher education shall repay the scholarship amount to the state.
- (b) The adjutant general shall add to that individual's accumulated eligibility units calculated under division (E) of this section the number of eligibility units for the academic courses or term for which the scholarship was paid if the institution of higher education agrees to permit the individual to complete the remainder of the academic courses in which the individual was enrolled at the time the individual was called into active duty.
- (4) No individual who is discharged from the Ohio national guard under other than honorable conditions shall be eligible for scholarships under this division.
 - (G) A scholarship recipient under this section who fails

to complete the term of enlistment, re-enlistment, or extension	187
of current enlistment the recipient was serving at the time a	188
scholarship was paid on behalf of the recipient under this	189
section is liable to the state for repayment of a percentage of	190
all Ohio national guard scholarships paid on behalf of the	191
recipient under this section, plus interest at the rate of ten	192
per cent per annum calculated from the dates the scholarships	193
were paid. This percentage shall equal the percentage of the	194
current term of enlistment, re-enlistment, or extension of	195
enlistment a recipient has not completed as of the date the	196
recipient is discharged from the Ohio national guard.	197

The attorney general may commence a civil action on behalf 198 of the chancellor of the Ohio board of regents to recover the 199 amount of the scholarships and the interest provided for in this 200 division and the expenses incurred in prosecuting the action, 201 including court costs and reasonable attorney's fees. A 202 scholarship recipient is not liable under this division if the 203 recipient's failure to complete the term of enlistment being 204 served at the time a scholarship was paid on behalf of the 205 recipient under this section is due to the recipient's death or 206 discharge from the national guard due to disability or the 207 recipient's enlistment, warrant, commission, or appointment for 208 a term not less than the recipient's remaining term in the 209 national quard, in the active component of the United States 210 armed forces or the active reserve component of the United 211 States armed forces. 212

(H) On or before the first day of each academic term, the 213 adjutant general shall provide an eligibility roster to the 214 chancellor and to each institution of higher education at which 215 one or more scholarship recipients have applied for enrollment. 216 The institution shall use the roster to certify the actual full—217

time or part-time enrollment of each scholarship recipient	218
listed as enrolled at the institution and return the roster to	219
the adjutant general and the chancellor. Except as provided in	220
division (J) of this section, the chancellor shall provide for	221
payment of the appropriate number and amount of scholarships to	222
each institution of higher education pursuant to division (D) of	223
this section. If an institution of higher education fails to	224
certify the actual enrollment of a scholarship recipient listed	225
as enrolled at the institution within thirty days of the end of	226
an academic term, the institution shall not be eligible to	227
receive payment from the Ohio national guard scholarship program	228
or from the individual enrollee. The adjutant general shall	229
report on a semiannual basis to the director of budget and	230
management, the speaker of the house of representatives, the	231
president of the senate, and the chancellor the number of Ohio	232
national guard scholarship recipients, the size of the	233
scholarship-eligible population, and a projection of the cost of	234
the program for the remainder of the biennium.	235

- (I) The chancellor and the adjutant general may adopt

 rules pursuant to Chapter 119. of the Revised Code governing the

 administration and fiscal management of the Ohio national guard

 scholarship program and the procedure by which the chancellor

 and the department of the adjutant general may modify the amount

 of scholarships a member receives based on the amount of other

 state financial aid a member receives.
- (J) The adjutant general, the chancellor, and the

 director, or their designees, shall jointly estimate the costs

 of the Ohio national guard scholarship program for each upcoming

 fiscal biennium, and shall report that estimate prior to the

 beginning of the fiscal biennium to the chairpersons of the

 finance committees in the general assembly. During each fiscal

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year of the biennium, the adjutant general, the chancellor, and	249
the director, or their designees, shall meet regularly to	250
monitor the actual costs of the Ohio national guard scholarship	251
program and update cost projections for the remainder of the	252
oiennium as necessary. If the amounts appropriated for the Ohio	253
national guard scholarship program and any funds in the Ohio	254
national guard scholarship reserve fund and the Ohio national	255
guard scholarship donation fund are not adequate to provide	256
scholarships in the amounts specified in division (D)(1) of this	257
section for all eligible applicants, the chancellor shall do all	258
of the following:	259

- (1) Notify each private institution of higher education, where a scholarship recipient is enrolled, that, by accepting the Ohio national guard scholarship program as payment for all or part of the institution's tuition, the institution agrees that if the chancellor reduces the amount of each scholarship, the institution shall provide each scholarship recipient a grant or tuition waiver in an amount equal to the amount the recipient's scholarship was reduced by the chancellor.
- (2) Reduce the amount of each scholarship under division
 (D) (1) (a) of this section proportionally based on the amount of remaining available funds. Each state institution of higher education shall provide each scholarship recipient under division (D) (1) (a) of this section a grant or tuition waiver in an amount equal to the amount the recipient's scholarship was reduced by the chancellor.
- (K) Notwithstanding division (A) of section 127.14 of the Revised Code, the controlling board shall not transfer all or part of any appropriation for the Ohio national guard scholarship program.

(L) The chancellor and the adjutant general may apply for,	279
and may receive and accept grants, and may receive and accept	280
gifts, bequests, and contributions, from public and private	281
sources, including agencies and instrumentalities of the United	282
States and this state, and shall deposit the grants, gifts,	283
bequests, or contributions into the national guard scholarship	284
donation fund.	285
Section 2. That existing section 5919.34 of the Revised	286
Code is hereby repealed.	287
Section 3. The amendment made by this act to division (G)	288
of section 5919.34 of the Revised Code applies to a scholarship	289
recipient who became liable on or before September 30, 2016, for	290
failure to complete the scholarship recipient's enlistment term	291
in the Ohio National Guard due to enlistment, warrant,	292
commission, or appointment in the active component of the United	293
States Armed Forces or the active reserve component of the	294
United States Armed Forces. Not later than one year after the	295
effective date of this act, the state shall return to a	296
scholarship recipient, who is no longer liable under this	297
section, any scholarship amount recovered from a scholarship	298
recipient who became liable under division (G) of section	299

5919.34 of the Revised Code, on or before September 30, 2016.
