A BILL

To amend section 143.09 of the Revised C	ode to 1
retroactively extend eligibility for	benefits 2
from the Volunteer Peace Officers' De	pendents 3
Fund to situations in which, on or af	ter January 4
1, 2016, a volunteer peace officer is	totally 5
and permanently disabled or killed in	the line 6
of duty.	7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 143.09 of the Revised Code be	8
amended to read as follows:	9
Sec. 143.09. (A) A volunteer peace officer who, on or	10
after January 1, 2016, is totally and permanently disabled as a	11
result of discharging the duties of a volunteer peace officer	12
shall receive a benefit from the volunteer peace officers'	13
dependents fund of three hundred dollars per month, except that	14
no payment shall be made to a volunteer peace officer who is	15
receiving the officer's full salary during the time of the	16
officer's disability.	17
(B) Regardless of whether the volunteer peace officer	18

received a benefit under division (A) of this section, death 19 benefits shall be paid from the fund to the surviving spouse or 20 dependent children of a volunteer peace officer who, on or after 21 <u>January 1, 2016,</u> is killed in the line of duty. Death benefits 22 shall be paid as follows: 23

(1) To the surviving spouse of a volunteer peace officer killed in the line of duty, an award of one thousand dollars, and in addition, a benefit of three hundred dollars per month;

27 (2) To the parent, guardian, or other persons on whom a child of a volunteer peace officer killed in the line of duty is 28 dependent for chief financial support, a benefit of one hundred 29 twenty-five dollars per month for each dependent child under age 30 eighteen, or under age twenty-two if attending an institution of 31 learning or training pursuant to a program designed to complete 32 in each school year the equivalent of at least two-thirds of the 33 full-time curriculum requirements of the institution. 34

(C) An individual eligible for benefits payable under this
section shall file a claim for benefits with the appropriate
volunteer peace officers' dependents fund board on a form
provided by the board. All of the following information shall be
submitted with the claim:

(1) In the case of a totally and permanently disabled volunteer peace officer, the following:

(a) The name of the police or sheriff's department for42which the officer was a volunteer peace officer;43

(b) The date of the injury;

(c) Satisfactory medical evidence that the officer is45totally and permanently disabled.46

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(2) In the case of a surviving spouse or a parent,	47
guardian, or other person in charge of a dependent child, the	48
following:	49
(a) The full name of the deceased volunteer peace officer;	50
(b) The name of the police or sheriff's department for	51
which the deceased officer was a volunteer peace officer;	52
(c) The name and address of the surviving spouse, as	53
applicable;	54
(d) The names, ages, and addresses of any dependent	55
children;	56
(e) Any other evidence required by the board.	57
(D) All claimants shall certify that neither the claimant	58
nor the person on whose behalf the claim is filed qualifies for	59
other benefits from any of the following based on the officer's	60
service as a volunteer peace officer: the public employees	61
retirement system, Ohio police and fire pension fund, state	62
highway patrol retirement system, Cincinnati retirement system,	63
or Ohio public safety officers death benefit fund.	64
(E) Initial claims shall be filed with the volunteer peace	65
officers' dependents fund board of the fund member in which the	66
officer was a volunteer peace officer. Thereafter, on request of	67
the claimant or the board, claims may be transferred to a board	68
near the claimant's current residence, if the boards concerned	69
agree to the transfer.	70
Section 2. That existing section 143.09 of the Revised	71
Code is hereby repealed.	72
