	authority of certified registered nurse	3
	anesthetists to select, order, and administer	4
	drugs and to direct certain other persons to	5
	administer drugs or perform clinical support	6
	functions.	7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4723.43, 4723.44, 4729.01, and	8
4761.17 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	9
Sec. 4723.43. A certified registered nurse anesthetist,	10
clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified	11
nurse practitioner may provide to individuals and groups nursing	12
care that requires knowledge and skill obtained from advanced	13
formal education and clinical experience. In this capacity as an	14
advanced practice registered nurse, a certified nurse-midwife is	15
subject to division (A) of this section, a certified registered	16
nurse anesthetist is subject to division (B) of this section, a	17
certified nurse practitioner is subject to division (C) of this	18

section, and a clinical nurse specialist is subject to division (D) of this section.

(A) A nurse authorized to practice as a certified nurse-21 midwife, in collaboration with one or more physicians, may provide the management of preventive services and those primary care services necessary to provide health care to women antepartally, intrapartally, postpartally, and gynecologically, consistent with the nurse's education and certification, and in 26 accordance with rules adopted by the board of nursing.

No certified nurse-midwife may perform version, deliver 28 breech or face presentation, use forceps, do any obstetric 29 operation, or treat any other abnormal condition, except in 30 emergencies. Division (A) of this section does not prohibit a 31 certified nurse-midwife from performing episiotomies or normal 32 vaginal deliveries, or repairing vaginal tears. A certified 33 nurse-midwife who holds a certificate to prescribe issued under 34 section 4723.48 of the Revised Code may, in collaboration with 35 one or more physicians, prescribe drugs and therapeutic devices 36 in accordance with section 4723.481 of the Revised Code. 37

(B) A nurse authorized to practice as a certified 38 registered nurse anesthetist, with the supervision and in the 39 immediate presence of a physician, podiatrist, or dentist, may 40 administer anesthesia and perform anesthesia induction, 41 maintenance, and emergence, and may perform with supervision 42 preanesthetic preparation and evaluation, postanesthesia care, 43 and clinical support functions, consistent with the nurse's 44 education and certification, and in accordance with rules 45 adopted by the board. A certified registered nurse anesthetist 46 may select, order, and administer appropriate drugs if the 47 selection, ordering, or administration is consistent with the 48

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education and certification of the certified registered nurse	49
anesthetist and is either (1) authorized by the clinical	
privileges granted by the medical staff of the facility in which	
the services are provided or (2) within the scope of practice of	
the supervising physician, podiatrist, or dentist in a setting	53
where clinical privileges are not formally delineated, such as a	
medical or dental office. An order for drugs by a certified	55
registered nurse anesthetist is valid for dispensing and	56
administration of drugs only in the facility or other setting	57
where the anesthesia services are being provided. In addition to	58
the authority to select, order, or administer drugs, a certified	59
registered nurse anesthetist may direct other licensed or	60
certified persons to administer such drugs or to perform	61
clinical support functions within the scope of practice of such	62
licensed or certified persons. A certified registered nurse	63
anesthetist is not required to obtain a certificate to prescribe	64
in order to provide the anesthesia care described in this	65
division.	66
The physician, podiatrist, or dentist supervising a	67
certified registered nurse anesthetist must be actively engaged	68
in practice in this state. When a certified registered nurse	69
anesthetist is supervised by a podiatrist, the nurse's scope of	70
practice is limited to the anesthesia procedures that the	71

practice is limited to the anesthesia procedures that the 71 podiatrist has the authority under section 4731.51 of the 72 Revised Code to perform. A certified registered nurse 73 anesthetist may not administer general anesthesia under the 74 supervision of a podiatrist in a podiatrist's office. When a 75 certified registered nurse anesthetist is supervised by a 76 dentist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the 77 anesthesia procedures that the dentist has the authority under 78 Chapter 4715. of the Revised Code to perform. 79

A supervising physician, podiatrist, or dentist is not	80
liable in damages to any person or government entity in a civil	81
action for injury, death, or loss to person or property that	82
arises from an action or omission of a supervised certified	83
registered nurse anesthetist unless the supervising physician,	84
podiatrist, or dentist exercised control over or participated in	85
the action or omission of the supervised certified registered	86
nurse anesthetist.	87

(C) A nurse authorized to practice as a certified nurse practitioner, in collaboration with one or more physicians or podiatrists, may provide preventive and primary care services, provide services for acute illnesses, and evaluate and promote patient wellness within the nurse's nursing specialty, consistent with the nurse's education and certification, and in accordance with rules adopted by the board. A certified nurse practitioner who holds a certificate to prescribe issued under section 4723.48 of the Revised Code may, in collaboration with one or more physicians or podiatrists, prescribe drugs and therapeutic devices in accordance with section 4723.481 of the Revised Code.

When a certified nurse practitioner is collaborating with100a podiatrist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the101procedures that the podiatrist has the authority under section1024731.51 of the Revised Code to perform.103

(D) A nurse authorized to practice as a clinical nurse
specialist, in collaboration with one or more physicians or
podiatrists, may provide and manage the care of individuals and
groups with complex health problems and provide health care
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services that promote, improve, and manage health care within
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the nurse's nursing specialty, consistent with the nurse's

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education and in accordance with rules adopted by the board. A110clinical nurse specialist who holds a certificate to prescribe111issued under section 4723.48 of the Revised Code may, in112collaboration with one or more physicians or podiatrists,113prescribe drugs and therapeutic devices in accordance with114section 4723.481 of the Revised Code.115

When a clinical nurse specialist is collaborating with a116podiatrist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the117procedures that the podiatrist has the authority under section1184731.51 of the Revised Code to perform.119

Sec. 4723.44. (A) No person shall do any of the following 120 unless the person holds a current, valid certificate of 121 authority to practice nursing as a certified registered nurse 122 anesthetist, clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, 123 or certified nurse practitioner issued by the board of nursing 124 under this chapter: 125

(1) Engage in the practice of nursing as a certified
registered nurse anesthetist, clinical nurse specialist,
certified nurse-midwife, or certified nurse practitioner for a
fee, salary, or other consideration, or as a volunteer;
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(2) Represent the person as being a certified registered
nurse anesthetist, clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse131
midwife, or certified nurse practitioner;
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(3) Use any title or initials implying that the person is
a certified registered nurse anesthetist, clinical nurse
specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified nurse
practitioner;

(4) Represent the person as being an advanced practice137registered nurse;138

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(5) Use any title or initials implying that the person is 139 an advanced practice registered nurse. 140 (B) No person who is not certified by the national council 141 on certification of nurse anesthetists of the American 142 association of nurse anesthetists, the national council on 143 recertification of nurse anesthetists of the American 144 association of nurse anesthetists, or another national 145 certifying organization approved by the board under section 146 4723.46 of the Revised Code shall use the title "certified 147 registered nurse anesthetist" or the initials "C.R.N.A.," or any 148 other title or initial implying that the person has been 149 certified by the council or organization. 150 (C) No certified registered nurse anesthetist, clinical 151

nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified nurse 152 practitioner shall do any of the following: 153

(1) Engage, for a fee, salary, or other consideration, or
as a volunteer, in the practice of a nursing specialty other
than the specialty designated on the nurse's current, valid
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certificate of authority issued by the board under this chapter;
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(2) Represent the person as being authorized to practice
any nursing specialty other than the specialty designated on the
current, valid certificate of authority;

(3) Use the title "certified registered nurse anesthetist" 161 or the initials "N.A." or "C.R.N.A.," the title "clinical nurse 162 specialist" or the initials "C.N.S.," the title "certified 163 nurse-midwife" or the initials "C.N.M.," the title "certified 164 nurse practitioner" or the initials "C.N.P.," the title 165 "advanced practice registered nurse" or the initials "A.P.R.N.," 166 or any other title or initials implying that the nurse is 167

authorized to practice any nursing specialty other than the 168 specialty designated on the nurse's current, valid certificate 169 of authority; 170 (4) Enter into a standard care arrangement with a 171physician or podiatrist whose practice is not the same as or 172 similar to the nurse's nursing specialty; 173 (5) Prescribe In the case of a clinical nurse specialist, 174 certified nurse-midwife, or certified nurse practitioner,_ 175 prescribe drugs or therapeutic devices unless the nurse holds a 176 current, valid certificate to prescribe issued under section 177 4723.48 of the Revised Code; 178 (6) Prescribe In the case of a clinical nurse specialist, 179 certified nurse-midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who 180 holds a certificate to prescribe issued under section 4723.48 of 181 the Revised Code, prescribe drugs or therapeutic devices under a 182 certificate to prescribe in a manner that does not comply with 183 section 4723.481 of the Revised Code; 184 (7) In the case of a certified registered nurse 185 anesthetist, issue orders for drugs or direct other licensed or 186 certified persons to administer drugs unless the nurse acts in a 187 manner that complies with division (B) of section 4723.43 of the 188 Revised Code. 189 (8) Prescribe any drug or device to perform or induce an 190 abortion, or otherwise perform or induce an abortion. 191 (D) No person shall knowingly employ a person to engage in 192 the practice of nursing as a certified registered nurse 193 anesthetist, clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, 194

or certified nurse practitioner unless the person so employed 195 holds a current, valid certificate of authority to engage in 196

that nursing specialty issued by the board under this chapter. 197 (E) A certificate certified by the executive director of 198 the board, under the official seal of the board, to the effect 199 that it appears from the records that no certificate of 200 authority to practice nursing as a certified registered nurse 201 anesthetist, clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, 202 or certified nurse practitioner has been issued to any person 203 specified therein, or that a certificate, if issued, has been 204 revoked or suspended, shall be received as prima-facie evidence 205 of the record in any court or before any officer of the state. 206 Sec. 4729.01. As used in this chapter: 207 (A) "Pharmacy," except when used in a context that refers 208 to the practice of pharmacy, means any area, room, rooms, place 209 of business, department, or portion of any of the foregoing 210 where the practice of pharmacy is conducted. 211 (B) "Practice of pharmacy" means providing pharmacist care 212 requiring specialized knowledge, judgment, and skill derived 213 from the principles of biological, chemical, behavioral, social, 214 pharmaceutical, and clinical sciences. (6) Performing drug utilization reviews with licensed	228
health professionals authorized to prescribe drugs when the	229
pharmacist determines that an individual with a prescription has	230
a drug regimen that warrants additional discussion with the	231
prescriber;	232
(7) Advising an individual and the health care	233
professionals treating an individual with regard to the	234
individual's drug therapy;	235
(8) Acting pursuant to a consult agreement with one or	236
more physicians authorized under Chapter 4731. of the Revised	237
Code to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine	238
and surgery, if an agreement has been established;	239
(9) Engaging in the administration of immunizations to the	240
extent authorized by section 4729.41 of the Revised Code.	241
(C) "Compounding" means the preparation, mixing,	242
assembling, packaging, and labeling of one or more drugs in any	243
of the following circumstances:	244
(1) Pursuant to a prescription issued by a licensed health	245
professional authorized to prescribe drugs;	246
(2) Pursuant to the modification of a prescription made in	247
accordance with a consult agreement;	248
(3) As an incident to research, teaching activities, or	249
chemical analysis;	
(4) In anticipation of orders for drugs pursuant to	251
prescriptions, based on routine, regularly observed dispensing	252

patterns;	
(5) Pursuant to a request made by a licensed health	254
professional authorized to prescribe drugs for a drug that is to	
be used by the professional for the purpose of direct	256
administration to patients in the course of the professional's	257
practice, if all of the following apply:	258
(a) At the time the request is made, the drug is not	259
commercially available regardless of the reason that the drug is	260
not available, including the absence of a manufacturer for the	261
drug or the lack of a readily available supply of the drug from	262
a manufacturer.	263
(b) A limited quantity of the drug is compounded and	264
provided to the professional.	265
(c) The drug is compounded and provided to the	266
professional as an occasional exception to the normal practice	267
of dispensing drugs pursuant to patient-specific prescriptions.	268
(D) "Consult agreement" means an agreement that has been	269
entered into under section 4729.39 of the Revised Code.	270
(E) "Drug" means:	271
(1) Any article recognized in the United States	272
pharmacopoeia and national formulary, or any supplement to them,	273
intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment,	274
or prevention of disease in humans or animals;	275
(2) Any other article intended for use in the diagnosis,	276
cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease in humans	277
or animals;	278
(3) Any article, other than food, intended to affect the	279
structure or any function of the body of humans or animals;	280

(4) Any article intended for use as a component of any 281 article specified in division (E)(1), (2), or (3) of this 282 section; but does not include devices or their components, 283 284 parts, or accessories. (F) "Dangerous drug" means any of the following: 285 (1) Any drug to which either of the following applies: 286 (a) Under the "Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act," 52 287 Stat. 1040 (1938), 21 U.S.C.A. 301, as amended, the drug is 288 required to bear a label containing the legend "Caution: Federal 289 law prohibits dispensing without prescription" or "Caution: 290 Federal law restricts this drug to use by or on the order of a 291 licensed veterinarian" or any similar restrictive statement, or 292 the drug may be dispensed only upon a prescription; 293 (b) Under Chapter 3715. or 3719. of the Revised Code, the 294 drug may be dispensed only upon a prescription. 295 (2) Any drug that contains a schedule V controlled 296 substance and that is exempt from Chapter 3719. of the Revised 297 Code or to which that chapter does not apply; 298 (3) Any drug intended for administration by injection into 299 the human body other than through a natural orifice of the human 300 body. 301 (G) "Federal drug abuse control laws" has the same meaning 302 as in section 3719.01 of the Revised Code. 303 (H) "Prescription" means both of the following: 304 (1) A written, electronic, or oral order for drugs or 305 combinations or mixtures of drugs to be used by a particular 306 individual or for treating a particular animal, issued by a 307 licensed health professional authorized to prescribe drugs; 308

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(2) For purposes of sections 2925.61, 4723.488, 4729.44, 309 4730.431, and 4731.94 of the Revised Code, a written, 310 electronic, or oral order for naloxone issued to and in the name 311 of a family member, friend, or other individual in a position to 312 assist an individual who there is reason to believe is at risk 313 of experiencing an opioid-related overdose. 314 (3) For purposes of sections 4723.4810, 4729.282, 315 4730.432, and 4731.93 of the Revised Code, a written, 316 electronic, or oral order for a drug to treat chlamydia, 317 gonorrhea, or trichomoniasis issued to and in the name of a 318 patient who is not the intended user of the drug but is the 319 sexual partner of the intended user. 320 (I) "Licensed health professional authorized to prescribe 321 drugs" or "prescriber" means an individual who is authorized by 322 law to prescribe drugs or dangerous drugs or drug therapy 323 related devices in the course of the individual's professional 324 practice, including only the following: 325 (1) A dentist licensed under Chapter 4715. of the Revised 326 Code: 327 (2) A clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, 328 or certified nurse practitioner who holds a certificate to 329 prescribe issued under section 4723.48 of the Revised Code; 330 (3) A certified registered nurse anesthetist, but only to 331 the extent that the nurse is authorized by division (B) of 332 section 4723.43 of the Revised Code to issue orders for drugs or 333 direct other licensed or certified persons to administer drugs; 334 (4) An optometrist licensed under Chapter 4725. of the 335 Revised Code to practice optometry under a therapeutic 336 pharmaceutical agents certificate; 337

(4) (5) A physician authorized under Chapter 4731. of the 338 Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic 339 medicine and surgery, or podiatric medicine and surgery; 340 (5) (6) A physician assistant who holds a license to 341 practice as a physician assistant issued under Chapter 4730. of 342 the Revised Code, holds a valid prescriber number issued by the 343 state medical board, and has been granted physician-delegated 344 345 prescriptive authority; (6) (7) A veterinarian licensed under Chapter 4741. of the 346 Revised Code. 347 (J) "Sale" and "sell" include delivery, transfer, barter, 348 exchange, or gift, or offer therefor, and each such transaction 349 made by any person, whether as principal proprietor, agent, or 350 employee. 351 (K) "Wholesale sale" and "sale at wholesale" mean any sale 352 in which the purpose of the purchaser is to resell the article 353 purchased or received by the purchaser. 354 (L) "Retail sale" and "sale at retail" mean any sale other 355 than a wholesale sale or sale at wholesale. 356 (M) "Retail seller" means any person that sells any 357 dangerous drug to consumers without assuming control over and 358 responsibility for its administration. Mere advice or 359 instructions regarding administration do not constitute control 360 or establish responsibility. 361 (N) "Price information" means the price charged for a 362 prescription for a particular drug product and, in an easily 363 understandable manner, all of the following: 364 (1) The proprietary name of the drug product; 365

(2) The established (generic) name of the drug product; 366 (3) The strength of the drug product if the product 367 contains a single active ingredient or if the drug product 368 contains more than one active ingredient and a relevant strength 369 can be associated with the product without indicating each 370 active ingredient. The established name and quantity of each 371 active ingredient are required if such a relevant strength 372 cannot be so associated with a drug product containing more than 373 one ingredient. 374 (4) The dosage form; 375 (5) The price charged for a specific quantity of the drug 376 product. The stated price shall include all charges to the 377 consumer, including, but not limited to, the cost of the drug 378 product, professional fees, handling fees, if any, and a 379 statement identifying professional services routinely furnished 380 by the pharmacy. Any mailing fees and delivery fees may be 381 stated separately without repetition. The information shall not 382 be false or misleading. 383 (O) "Wholesale distributor of dangerous drugs" means a 384

person engaged in the sale of dangerous drugs at wholesale and 385 includes any agent or employee of such a person authorized by 386 the person to engage in the sale of dangerous drugs at 387 wholesale. 388

(P) "Manufacturer of dangerous drugs" means a person,
other than a pharmacist, who manufactures dangerous drugs and
who is engaged in the sale of those dangerous drugs within this
state.

(Q) "Terminal distributor of dangerous drugs" means a 393person who is engaged in the sale of dangerous drugs at retail, 394

or any person, other than a wholesale distributor or a 395 pharmacist, who has possession, custody, or control of dangerous 396 drugs for any purpose other than for that person's own use and 397 consumption, and includes pharmacies, hospitals, nursing homes, 398 and laboratories and all other persons who procure dangerous 399 drugs for sale or other distribution by or under the supervision 400 of a pharmacist or licensed health professional authorized to 401 prescribe drugs. 402

(R) "Promote to the public" means disseminating a
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representation to the public in any manner or by any means,
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other than by labeling, for the purpose of inducing, or that is
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likely to induce, directly or indirectly, the purchase of a
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dangerous drug at retail.

(S) "Person" includes any individual, partnership,
association, limited liability company, or corporation, the
state, any political subdivision of the state, and any district,
department, or agency of the state or its political
subdivisions.

(T) "Finished dosage form" has the same meaning as insection 3715.01 of the Revised Code.414

(U) "Generically equivalent drug" has the same meaning as415in section 3715.01 of the Revised Code.416

(V) "Animal shelter" means a facility operated by a humane
society or any society organized under Chapter 1717. of the
Revised Code or a dog pound operated pursuant to Chapter 955. of
the Revised Code.

(W) "Food" has the same meaning as in section 3715.01 of421the Revised Code.422

(X) "Pain management clinic" has the same meaning as in 423

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section 4731.054 of the Revised Code.

Sec. 4761.17. All of the following apply to the practice425of respiratory care by a person who holds a license or limited426permit issued under this chapter:427

(A) The person shall practice only pursuant to a prescription or other order for respiratory care issued by any <u>one or more</u> of the following:

(1) A physician;

(2) A registered nurse who holds a certificate of
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authority issued under Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code to
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practice as a certified nurse practitioner or clinical nurse
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specialist and has entered into a standard care arrangement with
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a physician that allows the nurse to prescribe or order
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respiratory care services;
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(3) <u>A certified registered nurse anesthetist who, in</u> <u>compliance with division (B) of section 4723.43 of the Revised</u> <u>Code, issues an order for drugs or directs other licensed or</u> <u>certified persons to administer drugs;</u>

(4) A physician assistant who holds a valid prescriber442number issued by the state medical board, has been granted443physician-delegated prescriptive authority, and has entered into444a supervision agreement that allows the physician assistant to445prescribe or order respiratory care services.446

(B) The person shall practice only under the supervision647648648

(1) A physician;

(2) A certified nurse practitioner or clinical nurse450specialist who is authorized to prescribe or order respiratory451

care services as provided in division (A)(2) of this section;	452
(3) <u>A certified registered nurse anesthetist who is</u>	453

(C)(1) When practicing under the prescription or order of	459

(2) When practicing under an order of a certified	466
registered nurse anesthetist or under the supervision of such a	467
nurse, the person's administration of medication is limited to	468
the drugs that the nurse is authorized to order or direct the	469
person to administer, as provided in division (B) of section	470
4723.48 of the Revised Code;	471
(3) When practicing under the prescription or order of a	472
physician assistant or under the supervision of a physician	473
assistant, the person's administration of medication that	474
requires a prescription is limited to the drugs that the	475
physician assistant is authorized to prescribe pursuant to the	476
physician assistant's physician-delegated prescriptive	477

Section 2. That existing sections 4723.43, 4723.44,	479
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Section 3. Section 4729.01 of the Revised Code is 481 presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended 482 by both Sub. H.B. 124 and Am. Sub. H.B. 188 of the 131st General 483 Assembly. The General Assembly, applying the principle stated in 484 division (B) of section 1.52 of the Revised Code that amendments 485 are to be harmonized if reasonably capable of simultaneous 486 operation, finds that the composite is the resulting version of 487 the section in effect prior to the effective date of the section 488 as presented in this act. 489
