He later served with the law firm of Squire, Sanders, and Dempsey, retiring as senior counsel in 2012, and he was inducted into the Karamu House Hall of Fame in 2007. In addition, the Louis Stokes Museum was established by the Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority, and several buildings have been named in his honor; and

WHEREAS, The love, compassion, and understanding Louis Stokes so readily extended to others will long remain in the hearts and minds of all who knew him. Indeed, he was a devoted public servant and community leader whose exemplary career and civic service serve as an inspiration for others; and
