Honoring John A. Ruthven for seven decades of service to the arts in Ohio.

131st General Assembly of Ohio are pleased to extend special recognition to John A. Ruthven for his accomplishments as an 3 internationally known wildlife artist; and WHEREAS, A talented individual, John Ruthven has demonstrated exemplary initiative, enthusiasm, and perseverance in developing and sharing his skills. A native of Cincinnati, he is a 7 naturalist, an author, and a lecturer, and he is affectionately 8 called the "20th Century Audubon" for using the same techniques as 9 his predecessor, the late John J. Audubon. Entering the Cincinnati 10 Art Academy after serving with the U.S. armed forces in World War 11 II, he opened a commercial studio in 1946. He entered the 1960 12 Federal Duck Stamp competition, which he won with his Redhead 13 Ducks, and in 1971, he founded Wildlife Internationale, Inc., to 14 publish and distribute his limited edition prints; and 15 WHEREAS, John Ruthven has earned numerous accolades, 16 17 18

including the Ducks Unlimited First Artist of the Year and Cincinnati Nature Center Wood Thrush awards, the National Medal of Arts, and the Eloise Payne Luquer Medal, and his paintings have been featured at such institutions as the White House, the Hermitage Museum, the Smithsonian Institution's Preservation and Research Center, the Cincinnati Museum Center, and the Roger Tory Peterson Institute of Natural History. In 2013, he worked with the Cincinnati Nature Center and ArtWorks to create a 6,000-square-foot mural depicting Martha, the last passenger pigeon that died at the Cincinnati Zoo. His unwavering commitment to preserving wildlife through his work has earned him a reputation as a truly
