A BILL

To amend section 3721.041 and to enact section 1
3701.138 of the Revised Code to require the Ohio 2
Department of Health to prepare an influenza 3
vaccine information sheet pertaining to older 4
adults. 5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3721.041 be amended and section 6
3701.138 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 7

Sec. 3701.138. (A) As used in this section, "older adult" 8
means an individual who is sixty years of age or older. 9

(B) The department of health shall prepare an influenza 10
vaccine information sheet that pertains to older adults. The 11
information sheet shall contain all of the following: 12

(1) A description of influenza, including its causes, 13
symptoms, and methods of transmission; 14

(2) A discussion of the health risks that influenza poses 15
to older adults; 16

(3) A discussion of the influenza vaccine, including its 17

availability, the methods of administration, and its 18
effectiveness in preventing influenza and lessening symptoms and 19
complications of influenza; 20

(4) A recommendation that each older adult consult with a 21
health care professional to determine whether annual vaccination 22
against influenza is appropriate for the older adult. 23

(C) The information sheet may contain any other 24
information regarding influenza and the influenza vaccine that 25
the department considers necessary, including the following: 26

(1) The rates of influenza-associated hospitalizations and 27
deaths among older adults; 28

(2) The benefits to older adults from annual vaccination 29
against influenza, especially to those living in close proximity 30
to other older adults; 31

(3) The entities, facilities, or health care professionals 32
providing influenza vaccinations to older adults. 33

(D) The department shall periodically review and update 34
the information sheet. The department shall make the information 35
sheet available on its internet web site in a format suitable 36
for printing. 37

Sec. 3721.041. (A) As used in this section: 38

(1) "Advisory committee" means the advisory committee on 39
immunization practices of the United States centers for disease 40
control and prevention or a successor committee or agency. 41

(2) "Home" has the same meaning as in section 3721.01 of 42
the Revised Code. 43

(3) "Physician" means an individual authorized under 44

Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice medicine and 45
surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery. 46

(B) (1) Each home shall, on an annual basis, offer to each 47
resident, in accordance with guidelines issued by the advisory 48
committee, vaccination against influenza, unless a physician has 49
determined that vaccination of the resident is medically 50
inappropriate. The vaccine shall be of a form approved by the 51
advisory committee for that calendar year. A resident may refuse 52
vaccination. 53

(2) Each home shall obtain the influenza vaccine 54
information sheet described in section 3701.138 of the Revised 55
Code and post the sheet in a conspicuous location that is 56
accessible to all residents, employees, and visitors. Not later 57
than the first day of August each year, the home shall determine 58
whether the information sheet it has posted is the most recent 59
version available. If it is not, the home shall replace the 60
information sheet with the updated version. Nothing in this 61
division requires an older adult to be vaccinated against 62
influenza. 63

Failure to comply with the requirement to post the 64
information sheet shall not be taken into account when any 65
survey or inspection of the home is conducted and shall not be 66
used as the basis for imposing any penalty against the home. 67

(C) Each home shall offer to each resident, in accordance 68
with guidelines issued by the advisory committee, vaccination 69
against pneumococcal pneumonia, unless the resident has already 70
received such vaccination or a physician has determined that 71
vaccination of the resident is medically inappropriate. Each 72
vaccine shall be of a form approved by the advisory committee 73
for that calendar year. A resident may refuse vaccination. 74

(D) The director of health may adopt rules under Chapter 75
119. of the Revised Code as the director considers appropriate 76
to implement this section. 77

Section 2. That existing section 3721.041 of the Revised 78
Code is hereby repealed. 79
