Testimony on SB 296

**House Finance Committee** 

December 12, 2018

Chairman Ryan, Vice Chair Lipps and Ranking member Cera,

My name is Jay McDonald and I am an active law enforcement officer with the City of Marion. I am also the Immediate Past President of the Fraternal Order of Police of Ohio, and currently the chair of the legislative committee. I am writing on behalf of the 25,000 active and retired law enforcement officers who make up the FOP of Ohio in support of SB 296.

This is important legislation that provides a much needed update to the benefits that the families of those killed in the line duty receive. SB 296 will improve the financial security of the families who have given so much.
