
Chairman Huffman, Vice-Chair Gavarone, Ranking Member Antonio, and distinguished members of the House Health Committee, thank you for the opportunity to offer proponent testimony on House Bill 541.

In my position as one of the Directors of Nursing for the Ashtabula City Health Department, I see the struggle Ashtabula County Residents have with access to care for their healthcare needs. Residents are often faced with choosing other basic living needs over their healthcare needs. I had the opportunity to volunteer at a RAM (Remote Area Medical) clinic in West Virginia last fall and was very moved by the generosity of lay and medical volunteers that gave of their time to meet the healthcare needs of the Charleston, West Virginia community. I volunteered with several nurses that had traveled from out of state. There was even a group of nurses that had gone to nursing school together over twenty years ago and reside throughout the country and choose to get together annually and volunteer at a RAM clinic and have a reunion weekend. Such a touching way to give back and still be able to catch up with old friends.

HB 541 would allow for out of state licensed healthcare professionals to do such a thing in our state. Healthcare professionals that want to give back are restricted due to the license fees required currently in the State of Ohio for volunteerism.
